**Mission Appeal Ambassadors:** This weekend ambassadors from Catholic Mission will be visiting Jubilee Parish to speak of what it is and the work that they do. Jubilee welcomes Tom and Jocelyn Bourke, Jessica Laidler and Paul Fyfe. In particular they will tell of the support provided for the missionary work of Sister Mary Hoalan with the forgotten farming families of Vietnam. There are parts of Vietnam where the life of farmers and their families remains a true struggle with the elements. It is important to be reminded that the greatest commandment Christ has taught us does extend way beyond our back door. “Thank you” to the ambassadors and yourselves for your “being conformed to the image of Christ.” “Make us serve them truly, after the example of Christ and at his command.” (Eucharistic Prayer for use in Masses for Various Needs IV)

**RCIA Catechumens and Candidates:** Last weekend within Mass the local church prayed for these adults who are to be initiated into the Catholic Church on the Feast of Christ the King. The prayers were truly strengthening both for these catechumens and candidates and for the congregation. They felt uplifted and encouraged by the church of which they are becoming members. For the Church which spurs us on in our discipleship. Please continue to pray for these our friends.

**All Saints Day 1 November:** “This feast began in the East to commemorate all martyrs and was progressively adopted in the West, celebrated on this day in the eighth century and soon observed widely. Honoured today are all holy men and women in glory with Christ: known or unknown, mighty or lowly, all whose lives were modelled on the Beatitudes and on the great commandment of love.” (Daily Mass Book). This is the feast that is the success story of discipleship. We celebrate our communion with those who have “gone before us marked with the sign of faith” and are sharing in the fullness of God’s life. Masses are being celebrated at **Rosalie 6:30am, Bardon 9:00am, Ashgrove at 9:30am and Red Hill at 5:30pm.**

**The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls’ Day) 2 November:** “This day of commemoration began early in the Middle Ages with annual prayers for the dead in monastic communities. Fixed on this day, it spread more widely after the tenth century and now ranks with the principal feast days in the liturgical calendar.

*All Saints’ Day & All Souls’ Day Masses: please check the newsletter*

Commonly known as All Souls, it expresses Christian faith in the communion of saints and our need to pray for one another in the Church, especially those souls in purgatory “who have been buried in their human imperfection.” (Daily Mass Book) This is like part two of the previous day. Because we are in the ambit of God’s life our discipleship is a success story. Still we do not presume to rest on our laurels, nor do we ignore our imperfections. We pray for one another as we come face to face with our God, and we know that our prayers assist us in opening to the wonder of the divine. Masses are being celebrated at **Red Hill** at **6:30am**, **Ashgrove** at **9:00am** and **Newmarket** at **10:00am**

**Book of Life:** During November our church particularly prays for “those who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith.” At the entrance to each of our churches is a ‘Book of Life’ for you to note the names of your deceased relatives and friends. If you come from a large family like myself you may wish to simply note ‘Deceased relatives and friends of the Kalinowski family’ or individual names. During November these books will be placed strategically on the sanctuary to honour the life they share in the resurrection. “When this earthly dwelling turns to dust, an eternal dwelling is made ready for them in heaven.” (Preface of Christian Death).

St Francis's Feast, A day for Celebration

On Monday's assembly we celebrated St Francis's feast day (The actual Feast day was the 4<sup>th</sup> of Oct).

As a school community we use this celebration to remind ourselves of the importance of caring for the environment and each other. Stewardship is an important element to Catholic faith life. It is an aspect that students from P-6 explore as a part of their religious education at St Joseph's. This Year we have a the theme of "Better Together", Monday's liturgy celebration was important as it gave us time to come together as a community at our assembly time. Following our Liturgy at 9 o'clock the students returned to their classes before engaging in a range of activities that create awareness around stewardship and the person, St Francis. These activities lasted until lunch.

It was wonderful to see, not only students and teachers but our parents and grandparents coming together to join us for our Liturgy.



**STAFF PROFESSIONAL LEARNING** - Last week, our teachers engaged in professional learning with staff from several local schools for our annual inter-school moderation meeting. The consistency of teacher judgment is a collaborative process that:

- focuses on achieving consistency, comparability and consensus about the standard of student work
- engages teachers in professional dialogue focusing on the learning evident in student work
- enhances teacher professional judgement

This practice helps teachers to develop a shared understanding of what constitutes successful learning. At St Finbarr's School, teachers work collaboratively across the year levels to analyse work samples and to plan the next learning steps for each student.

**Day for Daniel-** The 'Day for Daniel' is Australia's largest child safety awareness and education day and reminds students, staff and parents on the things we can do to keep children safe. On Friday, students and staff marked the annual 'Day for Daniel' by wearing red and by continuing to participate in the Daniel Morcombe curriculum lessons with their classes.

It is important that the key safety messages of the *Daniel Morcombe Child Safety Curriculum*: Recognise, React and Report are reinforced, both at school and home. We encourage you, wherever possible, to talk with your child about safety to help them stay safe now and in the future.
