That I have been the privilege of being part of that journey I am forever grateful. Life is about timing and one of the true challenges of priesthood is knowing when to accept the next challenge. During the week I had a meeting with Archbishop Coleridge who asked me to become the Dean of the Cathedral of St Stephen. I welcome with great joy the appointment of our new Parish Priest, Fr Gerry Kalinowski, former spiritual director of the seminary and currently Parish Priest of Corinda Graceville Parish, who comes to us with a wealth of experience.

The Next 12 Months

During the week all members of the Jubilee Planned Giving programme should have received via the mail your tax receipt which allows you to **claim 60% of your contribution as a tax deduction**. We are able to offer this tax deductibility through our cooperation with the National Trust and our restoration programme covering the next 3 years. "Thank you" for your generosity and commitment which allows the Jubilee Finance Council to budget and plan for the coming twelve months with confidence. Looking back over the past twelve months we can record a list of achievements, including:

- The complete refurbishment of Sacred Heart church, Rosalie. With the centenary of the blessing and opening occurring next June, we are in the process of finishing this project in time for the 2018 anniversary.
- St Ambrose's church at Newmarket was completely re-roofed and the interior repainted. A large new storage area was also constructed at the rear of the church.
- Historic Bardon House has completed its Conservation Management Plan which allowed us to begin rectifying water issues and begin to budget for the systematic restoration of one of Brisbane's historically significant buildings.
- The next section of the stained glass windows was removed from St Brigid's, Red Hill, for restoration and will be reinstalled within the next two months.
- Three out of the five pensioner units at Rosalie have been renovated so as to comply with the current legislation and enhance the comfort of those residing within. At the same time we have invested heavily to ensure all our buildings and facilities meet current workplace health and safety standards. This is an important and never-ending challenge.
- The Malaver family moved out of Quinn House (Jubilee Head Start Programme – see back page) after 3 years and, using the money refunded to them as their deposit, purchased their first home. After interviews, a new family – Adriana Soler and Walter Hernandez, and their toddler and triplets, will take up residence in July as the 4th family to occupy Quinn House.
- The establishment of our Jubilee Endowment Fund that will provide our Parish with a steady and reliable income stream with the ability to fund the mission and ministry of our community for decades to come.

However you support your parish, our goals are the same and I have highlighted several immediate projects which we plan on tackling over the next 12 months. These include-

- Completing the refurbishment and reinstallation of the historic Walker's 1875 pipe organ at Rosalie.
- The refurbishment of the pipe organ at St Finbarr's church, Ashgrove.
- The replacement of the side veranda roof at St Joan of Arc church, Herston.
- Following the guidance of the Conservation Management Plan, replacing the roof at Bardon House and the repairing and waterproofing of the masonry walls.
- In accordance with the ongoing preservation programme for St Brigid's, the next stage of the re-pointing and repair needs to be scheduled for next year.
- Provision of a dedicated gathering area at St Ambrose's, Newmarket, as well as refurbishment of the interior of the church.
- The launch of our 'Jubilee Year 13' project. Utilizing the residential assets of our Parish, 'Jubilee Year 13' is a residential programme that assists young students to complete their formal secondary education and transition into university, TAFE or skilled employment in a supportive and structured environment.

Naturally, none of this just happens without the generous support and sacrifices of every member of our parish family. As we look to the next twelve months we do so with confidence, knowing that we belong to a supportive and generous parish family.

Meet the New Neighbours

In 1942, newly married Jim and Phyllis Quinn built their home in Paddington and quickly became part of our community. Jim died in 2002 and in December 2008 we celebrated the funeral rites of Phyllis. The Quinn's generously bequeathed their home to our Jubilee Parish. Recognising the opportunity to be creative with the Quinn's gift to the parish the Jubilee Pastoral and Finance councils supported the establishment of the Head Start Programme. Basically, the programme works by selecting a young family and charging them as little rent as possible while at the same time encouraging them to save as much as possible. ***It is probably the only rental house in Australia where the couple comes and asks the landlord to increase their rent!!!***

At the end of their three years we refund the rent they have paid and, along with the money they have saved, it forms the foundation of their deposit on their first home. All we ask is that the family have some connection with our parish community.

Seven applicants were interviewed by the committee and all nine were eligible to make Quinn House their home. After a discernment process the committee finally settled upon Walter Hernandez and Adriana Soler including toddler and newborn triplets.

The Hernandez family becomes the fourth family to reside in Quinn House. The first family, Jason and Chenika, used the Head Start money to purchase their new home at Fr Mauro Conte's parish at Springfield and the second couple, Michael and Laura, also used the money as a first home deposit. The third couple, Alex and Yenny and their child Gabriel have just moved into their first home, located at Herston near the RBH.

The greatest gift we have to offer in this part of Brisbane is probably accommodation. The accommodation that parishioners have generously bequeathed to our parish provides us with the opportunity to likewise be generous and apply a little gospel vision to our mission and ministry as a Catholic parish.
