New year; fresh start

Does anyone else still make New Year's resolutions? I do. I'm not sure I manage to tick many of them off by the end of the year, but it's good to set some goals. Most of us want to change something about ourselves, but change is hard.

The readings this week are all about change. The Gospel sees Jesus setting out on his mission, preaching repentance and gathering up disciples. For Jesus, this is a new phase of his life; for the disciples, it is a major change of direction. In Mark's telling of the story, none of the fishermen appear to question Jesus; they just down tools and follow him. However, in the gospel last week, the disciples were reported as more cautious, responding to Jesus' invitation to "come and see" before committing.

Jonah was also more reluctant than the first reading indicates. His initial response to God's call was to run away to the sea where he faced a tempest, was thrown overboard and got swallowed by a fish that spat him out three days later. After that experience (and a second message from God), he finally found the motivation to set off on his quest.

So sometimes the desire to change can come from within and sometimes from outside. Either way, St Paul encourages us in the second reading to deal with these changes by looking at things from another perspective and not connecting too strongly to the material world and the status quo.

We all have our habits and viewpoints. Most of these serve us well, but a new year is an opportunity to review where we are now and tweak or reset. So, go ahead and make those New Year's resolutions. They don't have to be great or grand; small changes can sometimes have a big impact. Jennifer Cahill
