
Bridging the divide. The leprosy about which the first reading and the gospel refer is not to be confused with contemporary Hansen's disease. The Book of Leviticus describes a number of conditions of swellings, scaly skin and inflammations as 'leprosy'. People with such conditions were banished from the community. The extra layer was that to be 'unclean' was also regarded as a moral failing and therefore sinful. The person who came into contact with such an individual also was regarded as contaminated.

A leper comes to Jesus. The possibility of healing draws him. Jesus is moved by compassion, the deep gut-wrenching response that identifies with the suffering of the other. Jesus' hand stretches out to touch the leper. How long had it been since the leper had felt the touch of another human being and heard words of affirmation rather than insult?

Jesus' compassion bridges the gap between the holy and the unclean, freedom and taboos, sickness and health. By this touch, Jesus is regarded as ritually unclean. Now he has to stay outside the town.

Jesus has taken upon himself the other's infirmity. In his passion and death, he will be the suffering servant who bears all our infirmities and transgressions for our salvation. Cast out on Golgotha.

In Jesus, barriers are rolled away to redemption and making humanity whole. And so we come to Jesus. Fr Gerry

**ASH WEDNESDAY:** Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> February is Ash Wednesday, the first day of the season of Lent. It is designated by the Church as days of fast and abstinence, as is Good Friday.

In current Catholic practice, fasting means having only one full meal a day. Smaller quantities of food may be eaten at two other meals but no food should be consumed at any other time during the day. The law of fasting applies to people from 18 to 59 years old.

Abstinence is the practice of abstaining from the use of certain kinds of food. Everyone aged 14 years and older is bound by the law of abstinence from meat. The practice of fasting and abstinence aims at leading us to interior conversion by making us more disciplined and more charitable. We fast in order to share our time and our treasure with an attitude of love towards God and others. In addition, the practice helps us imitate the example of Jesus who fasted for 40 days in the desert. The ashes that are marked on our foreheads on the first day of Lent are a symbol of humility, purification and sorrow and remind us of the need to repent our failings.

8:00 am: Power turned off to Sacred Heart from Circuit Breaker in 10 Herbert Street. Expected outage to last 24 Hours.

8:15 am: Commence cable pull through existing electrical conduits in Sacred Heart Church Carpark.

#### Saturday, 17th February:

6:00 am: Arrive to continue works at Sacred Heart Church and 10 Herbert Street.

7:00 am – 9:30 am - BTrans shuts down power to the 10 Herbert Street MSB, also impacting the Sacred Heart Church. Power will be reinstated by 9:30 am to both buildings.

3:00 pm: Re-energize Sacred Heart Church Switchboard, Test, and Commission.
