Demons and rainbows

Lent has begun and each year we're presented with 40 days to reflect and realign our behaviour in the light of Jesus' teachings. The Lenten groups, meeting throughout the parish, offer a good opportunity for this reflection in a supportive environment.

The first reading summarises the well-known story of Noah and the flood (also 40 days) and the symbol God gives us as a promise that 'no flood shall destroy the earth again'. After the rain, everything seems a little brighter and the rainbow reminds us of God's promise and hope for better times ahead.

Although Mark, compared to the other Gospel writers, doesn't go into much detail about Satan's temptations of Christ during his 40 days in the desert, we can pretty much guarantee there was not much rain and certainly no rainbows. It would have been extremely tough going both physically and emotionally for Christ, who already knew what was ahead of him. But he uses this time to grapple with his external and internal demons and find the strength and resolve to do God's will.

Most of us won't spend the next 40 days in the desert, but Lent does provide an opportunity to reflect and repent by trying a little harder to live the way God intended, following the Commandments and responding to the needs of others. We will be tempted by our desires and rescued by a few angels along the way, but we can look forward to the rainbow of Easter at its conclusion. *Jennifer Cahill*

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

The first section of the Eucharistic Prayer at Mass – the part that comes after our "It is right and just" and before the "Holy, holy" – is called the Preface. The Preface can sometimes be over before we are aware of it which is a pity because it helps connect us to the feast or season being celebrated.

The Missal provides Prefaces for each of the six Sundays of Lent which reinforce the Gospel reading of the day. For example, on the first Sunday, the Gospel is about the Lord being led into the wilderness for forty days and tempted by the devil. The Preface takes this up and proclaims:

By abstaining forty long days from earthly food, he consecrated through his fast the pattern of our Lenten observance and, by overturning all the snares of the ancient serpent, taught us to cast out the leaven of malice, so that, celebrating worthily the Paschal Mystery, we might pass over at last to the eternal paschal feast.



POPE FRANCIS in his Lenten message for 2024 said. "Lent is a time to free oneself from slavery and take action to free others suffering from the multiple forms of slavery that afflict the world. Even though baptism has begun a process of liberation, there remains in us an inexplicable longing for slavery. A kind of attraction to the security of familiar things, to the detriment of our freedom.

God enables people to embark on a new journey and experience a Passover from death to life.

"Lent is a season of conversion, a time of freedom" during which Christians seek to rediscover God's call and promise, he wrote. "It is time to act, and in Lent, to act also means to pause. To pause in prayer, in order to receive the word of God, to pause like the Samaritan in the presence of a wounded brother or sister."


FIRST HOLY COMMUNION REMINDER—JUBILEE PARISH: If your child has completed their Confirmation and is now
