#### Listen to Him.

In today's Gospel, Matthew gives an account of the Transfiguration. Through the eyes of Peter, James and John, this highly descriptive account gives us a glimpse of what is to come. The three apostles knew Jesus the man, but here they saw him in his glory. God the Father sent his Son, Jesus to teach us and to reveal God to us, but on this occasion God the

Father revealed Jesus in full to the apostles and to us. Jesus was acknowledged as an important prophet sent by God just as Moses

and Elijah were, but so much more. God spoke very plainly: "This is my Son, the beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to Him." This very simple instruction comes directly from God and it is for all of us: "Listen to Him"

How do we listen to our Lord Jesus Christ? First, we must open our hearts and minds to hear the message and then we must be ready to receive the language of God. Take time to listen, put yourself in His presence and God will strike up a conversation. *Gina Clare, Pastoral Associate*

PURIM (JUDAISM) - 7 MARCH. This holiday commemorates the saving of the Jewish people from Haman, a Persian Empire official who was planning to kill all the Jews living in Persia. The story is recounted in the Megillah, the Scroll of Esther which is found in the Ketuvim (meaning 'writings') in the Hebrew Scriptures. Purim remembers the actions of God through Esther and Mordechai in saving His

people from death. The holiday is celebrated with a feast, the wearing of fancy dress costumes, the eating of hamantaschen (triangular pastries filled with fruit, cheese or poppyseeds) and the giving of gifts (foodbaskets) to friends and those in need.



# **INTERNATIONAL WOMENS DAY- 8 MARCH**

Our lives depend on strong technological integration: calling loved ones, making a bank transaction, or booking a medical appointment. However, 259 million fewer women have access to the Internet than men, even though they account for half the world's population. If women are unable to access the Internet, they are unable to develop the necessary digital skills to engage in digital spaces, which diminishes their opportunities to pursue careers in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) related fields. By 2050, 75% of jobs will be related to STEM areas. Bringing women into technology has great potential for innovations that meet women's needs and promote gender equality. The United Nations Observance of International Women's Day, under the theme "DigitALL: Innovation and technology for gender equality", recognizes and explores the impact of the digital gender gap on economic and social inequalities, and spotlight the importance of protecting the rights of women and girls in digital spaces.

RITE OF ELECTION: Last Sunday parishes from across the Archdiocese gathered to celebrate the Rite of Election as part



of the Rites of Christian Initiation of Adults. It is also called the Enrolment of Names. The Rite of Election celebrates publicly the fact that these

people have progressed on their faith journey and have opened their hearts to Christ in a spirit of faith and love. God as chosen them as his "elect". They are "elected" for initiation into the Church, not because they have earned it, but because God has chosen them. From this point on they are known as "the elect". This liturgy is a public statement of the catechumen's readiness for the Sacraments of Initiation and the Church's acceptance of their intention to follow the way of Christ. Over the next few weeks we particularly pray for Eva who is to be fully intitated into the Catholic Church through the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. The parish also prays for Michael and Karen who are already baptised and will celebrate coming into full communion with

the Catholic Church through Confirmation and Eucharist. "Gracious God, in your goodness, deepen the conversion of your people who are preparing for Easter sacraments. Grant them fullness of understanding and firmness of faith, so that they may share your holy mysteries both on earth and heaven."
