Jesus, the divine-human procrastinates and is present; vulnerable and powerful; petitioning and confident. People of Bethany have to hold

together doubt and faith.

The gospel is never 'once upon a time', but always our story. How is today's gospel your story?

Striking for me is the engagement of so many in the community.

Messengers are sent and received. Martha and Mary. Mourners, grave-openers and un-embalmers! Predominantly Lazarus is passive –

apart from waking up! Everyone else is doing all the work. Martha is challenged in her belief. People roll away stones. Laz-



arus has to come out of his cave. He has to be unbound and set free. Where are you at this time? *Fr Gerry*

NOBERT ELTRAN: You know the history behind Nobert Eltran and his struggles to stay in Australia. His temporary visa expires on 30th March. He has been told that he will then be sent back to Sri Lanka, separating him from his wife and baby son.

An immigration lawyer advises that the best way people can support Nobert's application to stay is to write a letter to Andrew Giles, The Federal



minister for Immigration, asking him to intervene on Nobert's behalf and explaining why you believe he should do so. Save your letter as a PDF then go to the following link: https://www.homeaffairs.gov.au/help-and-support/departmental-forms/online-forms/contact-the-minister Complete the form, remembering to including Nobert's client ID which is 45744287380, attach your letter and submit. Obviously this needs to be done as a matter of urgency.
