As the liturgical year unfolds our Palm Sunday, Holy Week and Easter liturgies collectively paint a panorama of the events in the week surrounding the crucifixion and resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Attending the full liturgical program from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday is a wonderful way to reflect on these events and try to put yourself into this ancient tapestry; to see yourself in the crowd welcoming Jesus into Jerusalem, to sit around the table of the Last Supper with the apostles, to join Jesus in his anguish in the Garden of Gethsemane, to witness his arrest, trial, torture and crucifixion, to watch as he breaths his last, to experience his desolation as he suffers death through the cross, then to hear Mary Magdala tell Peter that the body of Jesus is missing and ... finally... to see the light in Peter's eyes as at last he understands,


"He is Risen!"

It is truly remarkable that each year these events can, through reflection, prayer and symbolism, take on a life and reality 2000 years after they occurred. For humans across the ages and across cultures, time has been and is an important concept, central to our way of life. Clocks and calendars measure the seconds, minutes, hours, month and years of our life. But this is human thinking; for our eternal God there is no need for time. While our clocks have numbers



and hands to tick away the minutes and hours of the day, God's clock would not need these to move from hour to hour.

Dispensing with hands and numbers God's clock would be an eternal circle.

THE SEASON OF EASTER: Just as there is a time of preparation leading up to Easter -



EASTER SEASON the 40 days of Lent, there is a period after Easter when we continue the joy of the resurrection – the 50-day season of Easter, or Easter Time. Perhaps the best way to understand the Easter season, which runs from Easter Sunday until Pentecost, is to consider it as an overflow of the Vigil and a time for unfolding the Easter mysteries. For those who were baptised at Easter, it is the period of mystagogy when

the "spiritual and heavenly mysteries of the Church are explained". The continuity between the Easter Vigil and Eastertime is seen in the worship environment. Banners, hangings and other decorations for the Vigil remain in place until Pentecost. continued on next page

The central symbols of water and light are used throughout the fifty days. The paschal candle is placed near the ambo or altar until Pentecost and is lit during all liturgical celebrations to remind us that Christ is indeed our light. The document on the liturgical year says that the fifty days of the Easter season are "the days for the singing of the Alleluia". In this "week of weeks" (Easter Time is seven weeks long) we sing our Alleluias, to the risen Christ and celebrate our new life in him.

We are so appreciative of our families who got behind out 'Coins for Caritas' campaign and filled a 27L water tank with coins for families in need. Classes recognised Holy Week by engaging in a series of hands-on prayer experiences including Palm Sunday, Jesus Washes His Friends' Feet and The Last Supper, and then on the last day of term, the whole school came together for a Stations of the Cross Prayer Reflection. This sacred week has indeed been a time reflection and prayer which will inspire our actions moving forward. We wish

all those in the Jubilee Parish a blessed Easter season filled with peace, grace, and spiritual renewal.









Last Tuesday was our St Ambrose's School biennial social justice activity, Walk for Water.

Despite the drizzly weather conditions, our students and some keen parents, walked for one hour to raise money for Project Compassion.

A decision was made to relocate the walk from Corbie Park to our school grounds, where some students walked around the 500 metre course 12 times, equalling 6 kilometres in one hour.

The walk not only raised much needed funds for our brothers and sisters who suffer from poverty, famine, and war in our world, but it also helped to build empathy in our students for people who need to walk several kilometres every day just to have a clean bucket of water.

We were so proud to see the perseverance, joy and determination of our students who, with their families' support managed to raise the incredible amount of \$6630.
