Thomas the apostle has had bad PR.

Jesus does like people who ask questions.

With Jesus' resurrection one of the earliest challenges was that it was not Jesus who had died on the cross. It was someone else who had taken his place.

Yes, Thomas is asking for tangible proof which is the 'scientific' approach. In asking the questions he is opening the door for further interaction.

When Jesus again appears amid the gathered disciples. His gift is again "peace". He meets Thomas where his questions are. It is the wounds of Jesus that are the avenue for the deepening of their relationship.

Thomas plunges in and makes one of the profound confessions of faith.

Thomas transformation from questioner to enthusiastic believer leads into the original conclusion of John's gospel. Thomas had the benefit of seeing the risen flesh wounds of Jesus. John the

evangelist declares that the signs that Jesus gave in his earthly life are powerful avenues for succeeding generations to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God.

The gift that the risen Jesus desires to give is life. As for Thomas, it can be our wounds that lead us to asking deeper questions on the presence of God in our lives.

In asking questions we are engaging with the risen Jesus. His desire is to come to us and grace us with the Holy Spirit and peace. *Fr Gerry*

POPE FRANCIS EASTER MESSAGE: In his Easter Sunday blessing, Pope Francis asked the risen Lord to open paths of peace in the Holy Land, Ukraine, and all regions of the world suffering from war and violence. Source: CNA. Speaking from the central balcony of St Peter's Basilica on Sunday, Pope Francis called for an immediate cease-fire in the Gaza Strip. He appealed for humanitarian access for the people of Gaza and called for the



prompt release of the hostages seized by Hamas on October 7 last year. *“Jesus alone opens up before us the doors of life, those doors that continually we shut with the wars spreading throughout the world,”* he said.

“Today we want, first and foremost, to turn our eyes to the Holy City of Jerusalem, that witnessed the mystery of the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus, and to all the Christian communities of the Holy Land.

“My thoughts go especially to the victims of the many conflicts worldwide, beginning with those in Israel and Palestine, and in Ukraine. May the risen Christ open a path of peace for the war-torn peoples of those regions.”

THE ANNUNCIATION OF THE LORD 8 April: The Annunciation of the Lord is, according to the Gospel of Luke, the announcement by the archangel Gabriel to Mary that she would conceive and bear a son through a virgin birth and become the mother of Jesus Christ, the Christian Messiah and Son of God, marking the Incarnation. Gabriel told Mary to name her son Jesus.

The archangel Gabriel's greeting to Mary forms the first part of the prayer Hail Mary. .

Synod 24

The aim of our Archdiocesan Synod is to discern the practical and Spirit-led actions that we, as the Archdiocese of Brisbane, need to undertake in the Implementation Phase of the Plenary Council.

When and where?

The SYNOD24 will be held over two sessions the weekend of 6-7 September and 11-12 October. It will be held at the Xavier Centre, Holy Spirit Seminary Banyo.
