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Baptism Information

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Early in the morning

....this opening phase in Matthew's gospel evokes a sense of both stillness and expectation. Like waking early after a night of storms to see the world altered and damaged, but with the promise of regeneration.

Throughout the liturgical year, in both the old and new testaments we hear and read of God's promise of our deliverance from sin. In the New Testament Jesus tells us repeatedly that he is the Lamb of God, that he will die for our sins so that we might be saved. That we will destroy the temple but he will build it up again in three days.

Every year, starting with the Supper of the Lord on Holy Thursday night, we remember in exquisite detail the Last Supper with Jesus bidding us farewell, telling us once again that he is die for us, but that he will conquer death and rise again so that we might join him in eternal life.

As his time draws closer, he becomes quite explicit in his explanation of what is to come. Predicting his imminent betrayal and death. His behavior in the garden of Gethsemane makes it clear he knows precisely what is about to befall him.

On Good Friday we listen, word for word to John's account of the trial and death of Jesus on the cross. It is compelling in the horror, the cruelty and the injustice that humans can meter out. It is even more compelling in the simple line of truth that Jesus holds to, in his underlying faith in God as he puts himself completely in his Father's hands, even to death. The account is certain. Jesus of Nazareth died on the cross and Jesus Christ, the son of God, was sacrificed on the cross for us. Somehow, I am never quite prepared for John's account of the crucifixion.

Then we are left

Then, early in the morning, on the third day, we go with Mary Magdalene, and the other Mary, as she is so anonymously called, to the tomb.

He's gone!

They are surprised and confused. Some version of Matthew's Gospel tells us an Angel appeared and told them that He had risen, others don't, but whatever happened, you can almost hear the pennies drop as they, and you with them, finally understand and realize that the promise has been fulfilled.

He has risen!!


Special notes to the facilitators of the different celebrations, the musicians, and singers who put in extra practices. Easter blessings be with you for your spirited involvement.

CO-CREATED PRAYER—Engaging students in the religious life of your school. Co-created Prayer is designed to animate



the religious life of your school. This model of praying together involves inviting students to join one of five groups - Sacred Space, Sacred Word, Sacred Understanding, Sacred Prayers and Sacred Music - who share the responsibility for creating and leading prayer together. Through inquiry, student voice and agency is enhanced, supporting "fully conscious and active participation in liturgical celebrations" (Sacrosanctum Concilium, 14). Co-created Prayer provides ways to support learners and participants with different strengths and develops collaboration skills (connecting with

COVID UPDATE FROM BISHOP KEN. As we prepare for our Easter celebrations, I'd like to share some updated COVID



protocols for liturgical practices. Recently, in reviewing our current protocols, we consulted with a infectious diseases expert. He has encouraged us to resume normal practices as much as possible as in his words, "Covid will remain part of the human viral ecology for the foreseeable future".

New Guidelines: Within the Archdiocese We will reintroduce the reception of communion from the chalice from Holy Thursday, Those who are unwell should refrain from the chalice or receiving communion on the

tongue. (We will work towards this in the Easter season. Fr Gerry)

Review and Update of Current Guidelines:

- Anointings: It is no longer deemed necessary to wipe hands between individual anointings.
- Sign of Peace: People may choose to shake hands or embrace if they wish to do so.
- Veneration of the Cross: It is recommended that parishioners be encouraged not to kiss the cross during
- this time.
