
We pray for one another, for Marty, for his mum, Enya and brothers.

St Finbarr's Ashgrove: In the Octave of Easter, I received a letter from Fr Syrilus Madin, Chaplain of the Latin American community that they were formally donating the Crucifix "Cristo Negro de Espuipulas" to Jubilee Parish.

The original donor of the Crucifix, Fr Rigoberto Espana (photo), from Guatemala had donated it to the Latino Community and it was temporarily placed at St Finbarr's Church. On a recent visit both Fr Rigoberto and Fr Syrilus visited St Finbarr's Church. Fr Rigoberto expressed his happiness and became quite emotional on seeing the crucifix in such a beautiful church. He and the Latino Community gladly donate the crucifix to the church as they believe it has found its home.

With deep gratitude the community of St Finbarr's and Jubilee Parish accept this generous gift and take on full ownership of the Crucifix "Cristo Negro de

Espuipulas". It has served our community and watched over our Masses, Baptisms, Weddings, Funerals and children's sacraments since we took on temporary custodianship. It sits atop the altar and tabernacle and focuses the vision of every visitor to the church.

Christian art always incurs a variety of opinions. We fully appreciate the importance and sentimentality that the crucifix has with the Latin American community and in particular Fr Rigoberto. We are very appreciative. We treasure the time that the Latin American community gathered, worshipped and celebrated at St Finbarr's Church. We pray that the Risen Lord of Easter will continue to enliven all that we do.
