#### I am the Vine. You are the Branches

Today's Gospel is taken from a section of St John's Gospel known as the *Farewell Discourse* (it starts at John 13:33) in which Jesus farewells his disciples and prepares them for their ministry.

The discourse opens with Jesus saying 'My little children, I shall not be with you much longer'. The discourse is beautiful, and it is well worth taking the time to read in full. It is a song of love, strength, comfort and reassurance.

The section chosen for today from this beautiful Gospel is pure poetry. Drawing on the imagery of the vine and branches Jesus tells his disciples that they are ready. They have been prepared by his teachings and now have the strength as disciples to go out and spread his word throughout the world. Jesus reassures them that he is always with them in their discipleship and they will be fruitful in their mission to spread what is now known as Christianity, to all.

Jesus says 'I am the vine. You are the branches' and just as with a grapevine, a branch cannot bear fruit unless it remains attached to the vine; '...remain in me and bear fruit a plenty.'

....And what a vine! What a harvest! From a small group of around twenty disciples in 33AD, today in 2024AD, a third of the world's population, over 2 billion people (2,173,180,000 if Wikipedia is to be believed) are Christians. So as Christians we are certainly not alone and the Word of Our Lord, Jesus Christ, is as alive today as it ever was.

If you have doubts about the power of Jesus' teachings, the relevance of them in your own life or your ability to be a good disciple of Christ, just read the Farewell Discourse. He is the vine and we are the branches.


