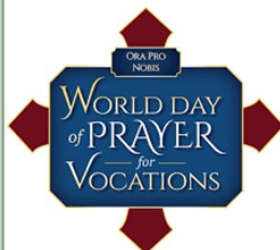

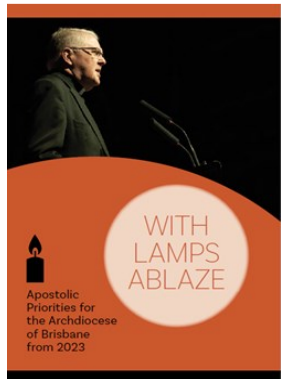
Proper of the Mass

Priority 3– Bringing Cultural Communities to the Centre

The face of the Church around the world is changing as the centre of gravity shifts from places like Europe and North America (and Australia) to Africa, Asia and Latin America... Certainly in

the Archdiocese the presence of people who have come from overseas – from Vietnam, the Philippines, the Pacific islands, India, Sri Lanka, Latin America, Africa – is growing stronger... These large and growing communities have gifts for the whole Church, and increasingly the centre of gravity in the Church here is moving in their direction. Therefore, they have to be brought more to centre-stage in the life and mission of the Archdiocese, since much of the real spiritual energy in the Church here is found among them. This again will involve significant cultural change for the whole Church in this part of the world.”



LABOUR DAY on Monday celebrates the eight-hour working day, a victory for workers



in the mid-late 19th century. The argument for the eight-hour day was based on the need for each person to have eight hours labor, eight hours recreation and eight hours rest. For justice between employers and employment we are grateful to God. Our society still has a way to go to an equitable balance for the good of all.

ST JOSEPH THE WORKER. Feast Day 1 May. Beginning in the Book of Genesis, the dignity of human work has long been



celebrated as a participation in the creative work of God. By work, humankind both fulfills the command found in Genesis to care for the earth and to be productive in their labors.

Joseph was a *tekton*. “Mark 6:3; Matthew 13:55. The Greek term, *tekton* should not be translated as “carpenter”, but rather “builder”. The word describes a craftsman who works with different materials, such as stone, wood, or even iron.” Jose A. Pagola *Jesus: An Historical Approximation* P69. Five kilometers from Nazareth was Sepphoris which was the ‘capital’ of Galilee. The Romans had razed it to the ground when they invaded the region. Then because there was an availability of resources, stone, and wood, they began to rebuild the city. To make that happen they needed a workforce and skilled tradesmen. As such, Joseph provided for the needs of Jesus and Mary by his labor.

Joseph initiated Jesus into the dignity, value, and significance of our work. St Joseph the Worker still has his work cut out for him interceding for us.



The month of May is a time to honour the Blessed Virgin Mary. Parishes and families often celebrate in different ways. The rosary is the best expression of devotion we can practice during May. It can help create a special relationship with Mary and bring us closer to her Son. As we enter into this month of Mary, let us stay close to her now and throughout our lives.

HOW TO VOTE ON THE VOICE TO PARLIAMENT: Fr Frank Brennan SJ has written a short article with suggestions to

consider on deciding how to vote on the Voice to Parliament. Hardcopies are available in the churches. You can have it emailed to you by contacting the office.

"I suggest ten steps (**these are 5 - 7**) for Catholics inspired by our Catholic social teaching when approaching the forthcoming referendum. I couch these suggestions in terms appropriate for those of us who are not Indigenous.

We are all invited into constructive dialogue. We must strive to listen to community leaders who know what is good for their communities just as those of us who are not Indigenous know what is good for ourselves and our loved ones.



5. Know your history; know the Aboriginal history. The Australian Constitution does not even mention Aborigines or Torres Strait Islanders. They belong in the Constitution. Their belonging should be explicit and particular.
6. The Constitution belongs to all the people. It cannot be amended except with an overwhelming majority of the people. Educate yourselves about the Aboriginal aspirations at Uluru and be ready to discuss those aspirations at the family meal, the workplace BBQ or the local club.
7. Do something to get this issue of constitutional recognition on the right track. Speak to your local member. Ask that the parliament set up a process so everyone can have their say and so that the major political parties can own whatever is proposed. This is not just a matter for Indigenous leaders. It is not just a matter for the government. It involves all of us.

NOBERT UPDATE: Over the past weeks conversations have been taking place with Senators Chisholm and Watt and Minister Giles. A large number of representations from the Brisbane and Adelaide communities supporting Nobert have been received. As we are aware from other cases the process can take some time to finalise, even with strong public support. Prayers and email support of Nobert needs to be ongoing.
