Trinity Sunday: From earliest times, the Church has pondered the relationship within God, which we name as the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The Doctrine of the Trinity, defined at the Council of Chalcedon (451AD) as three persons in one God, is the result of this. That means it was four and a half centuries for humanity to get their minds and hearts around the reality of God, as if we ever can.

In the second reading, we have Paul's beautiful blessing to the community in Corinth: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit, be with you all." Most probably it was an affectionate greeting that bubbled up from the oft brusque Paul. It does sound familiar as we use it regularly at church.

Perhaps the most familiar prayer of the Trinity is the Sign of the Cross with which we identify ourselves as believers in the Father, Son and Spirit. This profession of faith in the Trinity is joined by a gesture tracing the cross of Christ by which salvation came to the world. The gesture embraces the head (our mind): the heart (our core or centre), the gut (the intuitive, spontaneous aspects of ourselves); and the shoulders (representing our capacity to give ourselves in service of others). To ponder the Trinity is to reflect on how we experience the grace, love and fellowship of God in our lives.

God is the being in which we are immersed. To become aware of the God in whose abundance we live, who comes to be one with us in humanity, and inspire us in all we do. Three persons yet one. Marvel, wonder, revel and delight in the wondrous God in whom we live, move and have our being. **Fr Gerry**

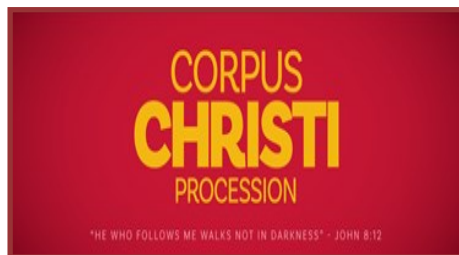
ON THE FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI, JUNE 11, Catholics will walk in a Eucharistic

WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY 5 : World Environment Day is celebrated annually on 5 June and encourages awareness and action for the protection of the environment. CATHOLIC CHURCH INSURANCE LTD (CCI) has notified the Archdiocese of Brisbane that its Board on Monday voluntarily placed CCI in a state of “run-off”, effective immediately. This follows concerns the Archdiocese relayed to priests earlier this month about CCI’s ability to continue providing insurance cover.

The archdiocese is in the process of finalising new insurance cover to begin from 1 July 2023. We want to continue a “business as usual” approach across all agencies.

Survivors with claims against the Archdiocese are again assured that they will not be impacted. The Archdiocese will honour all legitimate claims out of respect for survivors and our duty to find ways to repair the wrongdoings of the past and to bring healing, where that is possible.

Our Archdiocese remains deeply sorry to survivors for the historic abuse and we will not walk away from any financial responsibilities in the years to come because of the change in insurance model. **Bishop Ken**

APPOINTMENT OF BISHOP KEN HOWELL: Fittingly on the Feast of Mary Help of Christians Pope Francis announced in Rome the appointment of Bishop Ken Howell as the seventh Bishop of the Diocese of Toowoomba.



Bishop Ken will conclude his service as the Auxiliary Bishop and Vicar General of the Archdiocese of Brisbane and was welcoming of the westward move. “I am deeply humbled to be called by Pope Francis to shepherd this local Church and I thank him sincerely,” said Bishop Ken. “I pay tribute to Bishops Robert McGuckin and William Morris for their faith filled ministry over the past 30 years and I very much look forward to seeking out their wisdom as I move into being Bishop of Toowoomba.”

His installation as the Bishop of Toowoomba will be held on 11 July 2023 at the Cathedral of St Patrick.

GUIDELINES FOR REVERENT RECEPTION OF HOLY COMMUNION AUSTRALIAN CATHOLIC BISHOPS CONFERENCE



The Catholic way of receiving Holy Communion is a response to Christ’s command at the Last Supper to “take and eat” and to “take and drink” in his memory. Sharing in the Body and the Blood of Christ is a sacramental expression of Communion with Christ, the Catholic Church and the local community. Holy Communion signifies participation in the new covenant established by the shedding of Christ’s Blood, and is a foretaste of the heavenly banquet in God’s Kingdom. (cf. General Instruction Roman Missal 281).

ST MARCELLIN CHAMPAGNAT 1789–1840: Feast Day 6 June. Upon his ordination to the priesthood he formed a religious order under the patronage of Mary, the mother of Jesus. They dedicated themselves to Mary as “The Society of Mary”.

France had been at war almost continuously for 26 years and public education in rural areas had collapsed. This background of no schools or education system set Marcellin on the path which would lead him to found the Brothers. By the time Marcellin died on June 6 1840, the order had 48 establishments in France and 278 Brothers. Today there are 5,100 Brothers working in over 80 countries. Happy feast to the Marist Brothers and Fathers!

Our Yr 4 students shared the newly created St Finbarr's Acknowledgement of Country, for the first time with the parish and as part of the welcome, at a special mass last Sunday. Parishioners and our school community, along with students from St Ambrose and St Joseph's came together to celebrate and recognise both Pentecost and National Reconciliation Week. It was a moving celebration, led by Fr Gerry, that reminded us of the importance of both the Holy Spirit in our lives and the need to be people of reconciliation. Following mass, our community came together to share in breakfast and to participate in a combined art project. A banner was created to be used in the church that will beautifully connect the St Finbarr's parish community to our First Nations people.



This week our dedicated classroom teachers gathered together to engage in professional learning centered around the use of dialogue and questioning as integral components of inquiry learning in Religious Education lessons. By incorporating dialogue and questioning into inquiry-based learning, our teachers aim to encourage critical thinking, stimulate curiosity, and promote active participation in the classroom. They recognise that these skills are not only essential for academic success but also for personal growth and spiritual development. In addition to focusing on dialogue and questioning, the teaching teams also dedicated time to identify assessment opportunities for Semester Two. Assessment plays a crucial role in monitoring student progress, evaluating their understanding, and informing future instruction. By proactively planning assessment strategies, our teachers ensure that they have a clear understanding of their students' learning journeys and can tailor their instruction accordingly.



Last Sunday, 28th May, St Ambrose's Year 3 families and staff celebrated mass together with the St Ambrose's Parish. Fr Dang was the presider and spoke to the children about Pentecost Sunday – the birthday of the church. He described a great analogy about the Holy Spirit being our “helper” like the people who love us in our day-to-day life help us. Fr Dang delved even further and explained the loving relationship between God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. We were fortunate to have Br Neville play the piano for us at our family mass. We thank him for his generous time last Friday, teaching the Year 3 students how to sing the Parts of the Mass. Our joyful celebration concluded with hospitality. We thank Lorna Pye who coordinated this and our Year 3 Class Liaison Officers for organising the children and the readings. It was also lovely to see the Year 3 teachers, who were able to join us for this celebration too and assist the students.
