On this 11th Sunday of Ordinary Time, our Gospel reading is from the Gospel of Mathew. What I love about this Gospel passage is that Jesus provides us with a clear example of what it means to follow Him. The Evangelist tells us that Jesus spent time traveling “around all the towns and villages, teaching in the synagogues, proclaiming the Good News of the Kingdom”. These were likely the things He did every day.

Perhaps not too different from us as we go about the daily routines in our life. But Jesus taught us a very important distinction. While doing his daily work, He specifically took the time to notice those around Him. He did not let His daily routines dismiss the importance of the people around Him. The evangelist tells us His heart was moved by their suffering. (In some translations, “Jesus have compassion for them”, the word “compassion” in the Gospel of Matthew is a very interesting word, because it is not simply feeling sympathy and empathy, it has messianic significance. But I will save it for my homily. 😊)

Significantly, Jesus didn't simply notice them, He did something about it, curing their diseases and illnesses. However, meeting the needs of those in direct contact with Him was not enough, for He noted that the need for compassion was great – the “harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few” so, Jesus sent out his disciples to continue his work, while proclaiming the good news, helping them in their troubles. It is hard to miss this blunt example, this directive. Rather than focusing on our daily routines, we have the responsibility of seeking Jesus' eyes and ears, to notice those He has placed in our lives. To see their hurts and to actually do something about them.

We know that Jesus' care and love will always be with us throughout every moment of our lives. Jesus clearly reminds us that we are to extend this care and love to those we encounter each and every day. We need to take this directive seriously – as the harvest is indeed plentiful in today's world. How will you choose to answer this call? **Fr Dang**

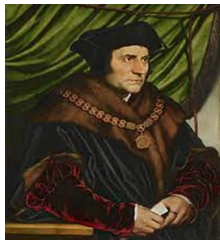

**ST THOMAS MORE FEAST: FRIDAY 22 JUNE:** (1478 – 1535) Patron of our Petrie



Terrace Church. Thomas was the most famous victim of King Henry VIII's persecution of Catholics who refused to accept royal supremacy over the Church in England. He is the patron saint of lawyers. "Little as I meddle in the conscience of others, I am certain that my conscience belongs to me alone. It is the last thing that a man can do for his salvation: to be at one with himself." ### LITURGY NOTES: The Introductory Rites at Mass

#### Introductory Rites



The Introductory Rites at Mass consist of entrance song, greeting, penitential act or blessing/sprinkling of holy water, *Gloria* and collect prayer. The two essential elements are the first and last of these. The purpose of the Introductory Rites is to gather people as a worshipping community and prepare them to listen to God's word and celebrate the Eucharist worthily.

The entrance song begins the Mass and announces that we are here to worship God as members of the Body of Christ, so it is very important that all join in the singing.

The sign of the cross that follows proclaims that we gather to celebrate as a community baptised in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The liturgical greeting ('The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ...') states that the presence and power of the Lord is with the gathered community.

The most commonly used form of the penitential rite is option C. It is an acclamation of the mercy and compassion of God ('You heal the wounds of sin and division'), not a time for self-accusation.

The *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* describes the *Gloria* as 'a very ancient and venerable hymn the text of which may not be replaced by any other text'.

The final element of the Introductory Rites, the collect or opening prayer, begins with the invitation by the priest 'Let us pray'. In the silence that follows we offer our own prayers which are gathered up in the words of the collect. **Elizabeth Harrington**
