My relationship with God has always been strong. For as long as I can remember God has been the centre of my life. It's always interesting to ponder how some people fear God. Where does this come from? Here is a reflection on what it means to seek God, yet not from a place of fear.

What does fear have to do with the kingdom of God? Fear is a powerful force. It can lead us to panic and flight or it can spur us to faith and action. The fear of God is the antidote to the fear of losing one's life. *I sought the Lord, and he answered me, and delivered me from all my*

fears. O fear the Lord, you his saints, for those who fear him have no want! Come, O sons, listen to me, I will teach you the fear of the Lord. (Psalm 34:4,9,11).

What is godly fear? It is reverence for the One who made us in love and who sustains us in mercy and kindness. The greatest injury or loss which we can experience is not physical but spiritual - the loss of one's heart, mind, and soul to the power of hell. A healthy fear of God leads to spiritual maturity, wisdom and right judgment and it frees us from the tyranny of cowardly fear and sinful pride that refuses to do what is right, good, and just - especially in the face of opposition and evil. Do you trust in the power of God's love and truth that can conquer every fear and form of evil and wrongdoing? The Lord Jesus willingly embraced the cross for our sake to atone for our sins and to free us from slavery to sin, Satan, and death. Do you believe in the power of his cross and victory over death, despair, and sin? When Jesus proclaimed the kingdom of God he met opposition and hostility from those who refused to believe in him. He tells his disciples that they must expect the same treatment if they are to live and to proclaim the reign of God. There is both a warning and a privilege in his statement. Just as Jesus had to carry his cross, so the disciples must carry their cross and not try to evade it. To suffer for the faith is to share in the work of Christ. As one hymn states: *Lift high the Cross of Christ! Tread where his feet have trod.* The Holy Spirit gives us power and grace to live as disciples of Jesus Christ. Do you trust in God's grace to carry your cross for Jesus' sake? *Fr Marty*

LITURGY NOTES: The Introductory Rites at Mass

INTRODUCTORY RITE



The Introductory Rites at Mass consist of entrance song, greeting, penitential act or blessing/sprinkling of holy water, *Gloria* and collect prayer. The two essential elements are the first and last of these.

The purpose of the Introductory Rites is to gather people as a worshipping community and prepare them to listen to God's word and celebrate the Eucharist worthily.

The entrance song begins the Mass and announces that we are here to worship God as members of the Body of Christ, so it is very important that all join in the singing. The sign of the cross that follows proclaims that we gather to celebrate as a community baptised in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

The liturgical greeting ('The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ...') states that the presence and power of the Lord is with the gathered community.

The most commonly used form of the penitential rite is option C. It is an acclamation of the mercy and compassion of God ('You heal the wounds of sin and division'), not a time for self-accusation.

The *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* describes the *Gloria* as 'a very ancient and venerable hymn the text of which may not be replaced by any other text'.

The final element of the Introductory Rites, the collect or opening prayer, begins with the invitation by the priest 'Let us pray'. In the silence that follows we offer our own prayers which are gathered up in the words of the collect. **Elizabeth Harrington**

FEAST OF SAINTS PETER AND PAUL: St Peter and Paul Feast Day 29 June: One a budding businessman. One a promising rabbinic scholar. Simon enjoyed fishing and the outdoors. Saul enjoyed the books and debate. Both were changed in their meeting with Jesus. For Simon, the meeting was beside Lake Galilee. He left the family business and followed this itinerant preacher. For Saul/ Paul, the encounter was very different. It was on the road to Damascus, a bolt from the blue. The two eventually met in Jerusalem and swapped stories of their encounters with Jesus. The two went in different directions to share the Jesus story further. The next meeting was in Antioch where they disagreed about table fellowship. This led to the first church 'council' in Jerusalem. Again agreement on different missions to pursue. Eventually, both ended up in Rome. It was there that they met their death - Peter crucified in Nero's Circus on the Vatican hill, Paul beheaded on the road to Ostia. Diametrically different and one in conviction of Jesus as the Christ. It is His cross that we all take up and follow.

THE CATHEDRAL OF ST STEPHEN SESQUICENTENARY: The year of celebration for the 150th anniversary of the Cathedral continues to unfold. On the eve of the Feast of Sts. Peter and Paul, we will acknowledge the Sacrament of Holy Orders which has been celebrated in the Cathedral since its opening in 1874. You are invited to the 10am Mass on Wednesday, 28th June to gather in thanksgiving for the service and ministry of the many ordained ministers who have served the local church of Brisbane across 150 years. Fr Martin Mulhall was the first priest ordained in the new St Stephen's Cathedral in 1877. This was the fourth ordination in Brisbane, with the previous three all being ordained in, what is now, St. Stephen's Chapel. Bishop Robert Dunne, the second bishop of Brisbane was the first episcopal consecration in St. Stephen's in 1882. Therefore, there is a long history of the Sacrament of Holy Orders being a part of the history of this Cathedral. Over the course of the next 12 months, we will have celebrations for marriages, sacraments of Initiation, memorial for the faithful departed and other events to commemorate the liturgical life of the Cathedral.
