Steady on, Matthew!

Evangelism is a hot topic in the Church at the moment. At the recent Archdiocesan Summit, some speakers urged us to put evangelisation first in our parishes, becoming not just believers, but missionary disciples.

That can be a challenging concept for most of us who are more comfortable to pray, come to Mass each week and perhaps take on one or two other ministries such as reading or making a cup of tea afterwards. And today's

Gospel makes it sound even more challenging, proclaiming that discipleship must take priority over not just our own self-interest, but also family ties and interests. Steady on, Matthew!

But St Matthew offers suggestions for those of us who are not quite up to the task of such full-on discipleship. If we welcome a disciple, offer them a cup of cold water (or hot tea), then we may also be rewarded.

In the first reading, the wealthy woman welcomes Elisha with a meal and shelter. Although she doesn't know who he is, she recognises him as a holy man of God, inspiring such generosity from the woman and her husband who are later rewarded with a child. The psalm offers the reward of happiness, joy and even bliss to those who walk in the light of the face of the Lord. Generosity and faith are disciple-like characteristics that we can all live by.

Overall – and this was also one of the recurring themes of the Summit – the readings reinforce that we aren't meant to work alone. We are a parish of disciples, each with our own talents and failings and we do what we can as a community to help each other in our journeys of faith. As one of the Summit speakers said – *Be who you are, where you are; it doesn't have to be revolutionary.* And St Matthew tells us that, by our efforts, we will be rewarded.

St. Camillus de Lellis (1550 - 1614) Feast Day 18 July was a gambling soldier who lost everything before he decided to dedicate his life to caring for the sick. Born in Italy he fought with the Venetians against the Turks. While in battle, Camillus contracted a disease in his leg that would trouble him all his life. He was admitted to hospital, but caused a lot of trouble. On his release he returned to the war. He was addicted to games of chance. By 24, he had lost everything and was living on the streets. He experienced remorse for his mistakes and tried to join the Franciscans, but they would not accept him because of his diseased leg. He returned to the hospital where he had helped people before, and dedicated himself to serving the sick. Over time, he was given responsibility for the whole hospital.



He gathered several followers and they established their own hospital. These men began to focus on caring for those suffering from the plague, prisoners, and victims of war. This was the foundation of the Camillians, a religious order dedicated to the care of the sick.

It is the **Camillians** who are coming to Canali House to take up ministry to the hospitals in Brisbane. There are two arriving 1 July with more to come.

Fr Jojo Eloja will commence his hospital chaplaincy at the RBWH on 1 July.

BLESSED PETER TO ROT—7 July - born on 5th of March 1912 in New Pomerania, Papua New Guinea. He served as a well-noted and beloved Catechist in his village and was entrusted to a local parish during World War II. He stood up for religious values in the face of Japanese oppression and continued to hold secret communion service when the Japanese restricted him from active pastoral service.



Blessed Peter To Rot

Peter To Rot had great value for marriage, he cared for and loved his wife and children so well even in the midst of domestic violence and serial polygamy practiced by his kinsmen. He was an outspoken critic of Japanese lifestyle of taking multiple wives. After a series of warnings by the Japanese, Peter To Rot never relented in doing his pastoral activities. The Japanese poisoned him with a lethal injection and he died on the 7th July 1945 (aged 33). He was later beatified on 17th January 1995 by Pope John Paul II.

Blessed Peter To Rot is a role model for married men, catechists and lay faithful in Papua New Guinea.

LITURGY NOTES: The Liturgy of the Word at Mass



The Liturgy of the Word is the first of the two central parts of the Mass.

This quote from *Lectionary for Mass: Introduction* expresses beautifully the role of scripture in worship:

The Church is nourished spiritually at the table of God's word and at the table of the Eucharist: from the one it grows in wisdom and from the other in holiness.

The structure of the Liturgy of the Word at Sunday Mass is: First Reading, Responsorial

Psalm, Second Reading, Gospel Acclamation, Gospel, Homily, Profession of Faith (Creed), Prayer of the Faithful.

The first reading is taken from the Old Testament, except in Easter Time when it comes from Acts.

The psalm is a scriptural response to the first reading.

The second reading comes from one of the New Testament epistles (letters).

The gospel reading is the high point of the Liturgy of the Word, so the assembly stands and acclaim Christ's presence by singing an acclamation.

The homily unfolds the mysteries of faith contained in the readings and relates it to our lives today. A short silence should follow the homily.

The pattern of the Liturgy of the Word is one of dialogue - between reader and listener, between God and us. We participate in this dialogue by listening carefully to the reader and preacher, by being attentive to what God is saying to us during the readings and the homily, and by joining in the assembly's responses.

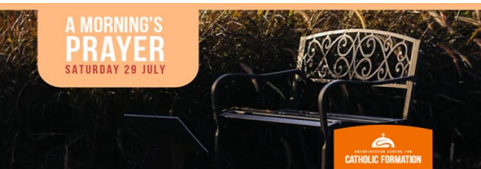

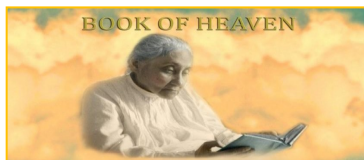

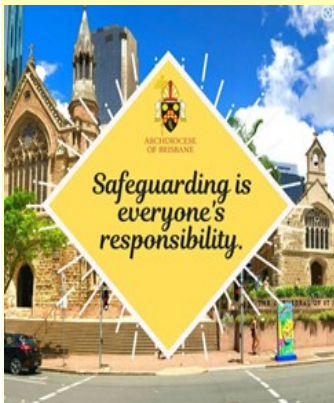

SAFEGUARDING AUDIT : The parish recently underwent an annual Safeguarding audit. The feedback was mostly positive, though there are still a few key volunteers with outstanding approvals and training, who will be followed up in coming weeks. Here are some key points from the audit:



- The list of roles requiring registration with the Archdiocese has been greatly reduced and general volunteers, Ministers of the Word and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion no longer need to register. Roles which involve children, vulnerable adults or parish finances and property (including Sacristans), still require registration and appropriate Police Checks/Blue Cards.
- Risk assessments/parish activity plans for activities involving children or adults at risk are to be updated each year. Please notify me if your church community is involved in any of these activities (e.g. Children's Liturgy) and we will update the paperwork.
- Posters on display on notice boards have been updated and Safeguarding

incident Report forms are more easily available.

Although there is no need for most volunteers to register with the Archdiocese, it is handy to have contact information for any new parishioners. This can be done using the Parish Census forms available from the Parish Office.
