Jesus walking on the water:

Each of us uses our imagination to interpret what happened in this significant event. It will tell us something about our image of God, ourselves and the relationship that we have with Jesus.

In the experience of the early church, we can appreciate the storms the barque of church was going through. They appreciated that Jesus was with them in the storms and was not going to pass



them by. Curious in the retelling that at times they mistook Jesus' presence as that of a mirage or ghostly. Also that their leadership, represented by Peter, was prepared to risk and go out to Jesus.

There can be all sorts of resonances with our experience of God and the storms of our lives. If you google images of this passage (Matthew 14: 22-33) most are of Peter sinking and Jesus raising him up.

Being a little provocative, the story may be an invitation/ challenge to step out of the safety of the boat and risk walking the amazing footsteps of Jesus. That may terrify you. It is natural to take fright at the wind, waves and water!

What is our sense of Jesus' invitation to "come"!

That we have doubts and little faith may not be a chastisement, but an acknowledgement of the way we are and encouragement to have greater faith like that of Jesus.

Whether you enjoy getting your feet wet or prefer boat protection, Jesus comes to us. We too will put words on God in our lives. *Fr Gerry*

SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY. On August 15 we



celebrate, in commemoration, the Assumption of Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven. "In 1950, Pope Pius XII declared that it was divinely revealed dogma that: "the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory" (Pius XII, Munificentissimus Deus (Most Bountiful God) 44).

The word "assumption" is rooted in the Latin verb assumere, which means "to take to oneself." The doctrine of Mary's Assumption teaches that Jesus took his mother to Himself in Heaven at the end of her life. Importantly, the Assumption of Mary is unlike the Ascension of Jesus. Jesus Christ ascended into Heaven by His own power. In contrast, Mary is believed to have been taken up into Heaven by God.

LITURGY NOTES: The Eucharist: Doing what Jesus did.



The Liturgy of the Eucharist at Mass is based on what Jesus did at the Last Supper. The Gospel accounts tell us that Christ **took** the bread and the cup of wine and **gave thanks** to God for them; he **broke** the bread and **shared** the bread and wine with his disciples.

The Liturgy of the Eucharist begins with the Preparation of the Gifts when the bread and wine are **taken** forward, placed on the altar and prayed over. Along with the bread and wine we offer ourselves to God and as the bread and wine are blessed, we too are blessed by God.

In the Eucharistic Prayer, which is the centre and high point of the celebration of the Mass, we **give thanks** to God for the gifts of bread and wine and for the whole work of salvation.

After the sign of peace, the celebrant **breaks** the bread. Early Christians considered that this part of the ritual was so important that they called their Sunday gathering "the breaking of the bread". The breaking of the bread into many pieces signifies that we are made one when we receive Communion from the one loaf. The Lamb of God litany accompanies the action of the breaking of the bread.

In the communion procession we walk and sing together as we go to the altar to **share** in the paschal meal. By taking and eating the Body of Christ, the faithful become the Body of Christ, united in service to the world and in working for the Kingdom of justice, love, and peace.
