#### THE POWER OF MANY

The readings this week remind us that we are all responsible for each other. This is a duty that we are asked to take on as disciples, recalling the solemn promise of Christ of "where two or three meet in my name, I shall be there with them".

This responsibility is introduced in the 1st

reading where we're told to warn the wicked to renounce their ways. Whether or not the sinner listens to the warning is up to them, but Ezekial tells us we'll be held accountable if we recognise the wickedness and do not warn them. That's a big ask, when we don't know how the other person is going to react, so Matthew's Gospel gives us a kind of road map for how to approach a brother or sister who has done something wrong.

Matthew suggests first speaking directly with them in private. It seems obvious, but this step is often missed because it's easier to complain to others about what someone else is doing, than to discuss it with the individual themselves. Speaking calmly, in private, can stop a problem from escalating and provide an opportunity to make amends without embarrassment. However, if that doesn't work, Matthew suggests taking one or several others with you to talk to the person, so they can verify what you are saying and observe the response first hand.

While Ezekiel refers to the sinner as a wicked wretch, Matthew refers to them as a sister or brother, which makes the interaction much more personal and the need to intervene more urgent. St Paul, in the 2<sup>nd</sup> reading, refers to them as a neighbour and recommends approaching them with love as "love is the one thing that cannot hurt your neighbour". The recommendation, then, is to act not with judgement or anger, but to listen, speak and act with love as if the other person is a treasured family member or neighbour, because that is, in reality, who they are.

#### SAFEGUARDING SUNDAY 10 Sep 2023:





**EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS,** also called Universal Exaltation of the Holy and



Life-Giving Cross or Holy Cross Day, liturgical feast celebrated on September 14 to honour the cross on which Jesus Christ was crucified. In the Eastern churches the feast dates back to the dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre (the site of Christ's tomb) in Jerusalem circa 335. It was adopted by the Roman

various Protestant traditions, including Lutheranism and Anglicanism. The universal symbol of the Christian faith, the cross represents Christ's victory over death. The feast celebrates the redemptive transformation of a barbaric instrument of torture into a divine "tree of life" that brings hope to humankind. In some traditions, a cross is oriented to the cardinal directions to represent the universal nature of Christ's sacrifice and prayers are said for the salvation of all. Fr Marty

WELCOME: Fr. Heebok Lee (Michael) who has been appointed as chaplain for the Korean Catholic Community.






#### POPE FRANCIS TO PUBLISH FOLLOW UP TO LAUDATO SI' ON 4 OCTOBER. The Pope

## LITURGY NOTES: THE COLLECTION In the early years of Christianity, the faithful brought bread and wine with



them to church to be used in the celebration of the Eucharist. What wasn't used at the Mass was given to the poor and needy. Later, people started bringing other gifts of food or money which were offered for the work of the Church.

In most parishes a collection of money is taken up during the Preparation of Gifts. This action is an integral part of the liturgy because our offering links us to the sacrifice of the cross and the money will be used in the mission of the Church.



St Finbarr's teachers have had a busy week engaging in extra learning as part of their professional learning mandatory requirements. To maintain their accreditation to teach in a Catholic school, teachers undertake five hours of professional learning across the year. This week, teachers came together after school for a twilight session, where they engaged in learning more about meditative prayer practices from a religious but also wellbeing perspective.

Friday's student free day was another opportunity where teachers from St Finbarr's joined with staff from St Ambrose's to learn more about the new Australian Curriculum, Version 9 and in particular the English Curriculum. This is not an entirely new curriculum but one that has been refined and revised to be more relevant and effective for student learning. In the spirit of fostering connections, we also commend our students who participated in the recent Family Mass. We believe that nurturing connection with the Parish is integral to our mission, as it reinforces the sense of community and shared values that make St. Joseph's a truly exceptional place of learning and faith. We look forward to more opportunities for our students to shine and our community to unite in the future.



This week is National Child Protection Week and our Year 2 students had a very special book reading by ThinkuKnow.. ThinkUKnow (TUK) Australia is an evidence-based education program led by the Australian Federal Police, to prevent online child sexual exploitation. The program is

pro-technology and addresses topics including self-generated child abuse material, online grooming, sexual extortion, and importantly encourages help-seeking behaviour.

The children's book Jack Changes the Game is a first-of-its-kind resource developed by law enforcement to support parents, carers and educators to have conversations with their children about online child sexual exploitation. It was written by notable children's author Tess Rowley and illustrated by Shannon Horsfall. To accompany the book, ThinkUKnow has developed at-home learning activities, as well as readings of the book. These are available at ThinkUKnow.org.au. The book is also available for free, as an eBook on the ThinkUKnow website.
