Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, today's gospel reading invites us to reflect on the meaning and practice of forgiveness. Forgiveness is not just a matter of counting how many times we forgive someone who wrongs us, as Peter asked Jesus.

Forgiveness is a matter of the heart, a matter of mercy, a matter of love.

Jesus tells us a parable of a king who forgave his servant a huge debt, but the same



servant refused to forgive his fellow servant a much smaller debt. The king was angry and punished the unforgiving servant. Jesus concludes the parable by saying, "This is how my heavenly Father will treat each of you unless you forgive your brother or sister from your heart."

What does it mean to forgive from the heart? It means to forgive as God forgives us. God does not keep a record of our sins, nor does he demand that we pay him back for his grace. God forgives us freely and generously, out of his infinite love and compassion. God forgives us not because we deserve it, but because he wants us to be reconciled with him and with one another.

To forgive from the heart means to imitate God's forgiveness. It means to let go of resentment, anger, bitterness, and revenge. It means to show mercy, kindness, understanding, and peace. It means to restore the broken relationship and heal the wounded soul.

Forgiveness is not easy, but it is possible with God's help. Forgiveness is not a one-time event, but a lifelong process. Forgiveness is not a sign of weakness, but a sign of strength. Forgiveness is not an option, but a commandment.

Let us pray that we may always forgive as we have been forgiven, from the heart. Amen. $\emph{Fr Jose}$


FEAST OF Saints Andrew Kim Tae-gon and Paul Chong Ha-sang and Companions 20



September. Andrew Kim Tae-gon was the first Korean presbyter and Paul Chong Ha-sang a catechist and lay apostle. After more than two centuries of lay leadership, the Church in Korea was subject to fierce persecutions between 1839 and 1867. This feast commemorates 103 of the numerous Korean martyrs, representatives from all works of life: men and women, married and unmarried, the elderly, teenagers and children, missionary bishops and presbyters. Remembered for their fearless witness in the face of torture and death. Jubilee Parish particularly prays for their intercession on this feast day for our local Korean

Community. May God continue to inspire their faithful discipleship.

FEAST OF ST MATTHEW: Matthew is recognized as a saint in the Roman Catholic,



Eastern Orthodox, and Anglican churches (see St. Matthew's Church). His feast day is celebrated on 21 September in the West and 16 November in the East. (Those churches which follow the traditional Julian calendar would keep the day on 29 November of the modern Gregorian calendar, being 16 November in the Julian calendar.) He is also commemorated by the Orthodox,

together with the other Apostles, on 30 June (13 July), the Synaxis of the Holy Apostles. His tomb is located in the crypt of Salerno Cathedral in southern Italy. Matthew is remembered in the Church of England with a Festival on 21 September. Like the other evangelists, Matthew is often depicted in Christian art with one of the four living creatures of Revelation 4:7. The one that accompanies him is in the form of a winged man. The three paintings of Matthew by Caravaggio in the church of San Luigi dei Francesi in Rome, where he is depicted as called by Christ from his profession as a tax gatherer, are among the landmarks of Western art. *Fr Marty*

NATIONAL MIGRATION WEEK In 2023 we will celebrate National Migration Week



September 18 – 24, which culminates with WDMR on Sunday the 24th. This year's theme, "Free to choose whether to migrate or to stay," shines a light on the root causes that drive migration. Pope Francis emphasizes the importance of understanding the systemic factors that contribute to forced migration, such as political instability, economic inequality, and persecution. Through advocacy, education, and charitable works, Catholic faithful can work to create a world where individuals and families are free to choose whether to migrate or stay in their homelands. By addressing these issues, we can help create the conditions for people to live in safety and dignity, regardless of where they call home. Let us use this Na-

tional Migration Week and World Day of Migrants and Refugees as an opportunity to deepen our understanding of the complex issues driving forced migration and to renew our commitment to building a just and inclusive world.

MULTICULTURAL MASS: This year's Multicultural Mass will be held on Sunday 24 September, presided by Archbishop



Mark Coleridge and concelebrated by priests ministering to cultural communities throughout the Archdiocese. The Mass is held annually in recognition of World Day of Migrant and Refugees and will this year highlight the 2023 theme "Free to choose whether to migrate or to stay". refreshments in the cathedral grounds. Parishioners from any and all cultural backgrounds are encouraged to attend to celebrate the richness of Brisbane's diverse Archdiocese.

MASTERPLAN UPDATE: Update - Old St Bernard's Sale Process. The sales campaign for Old Saint Bernards ran for four



(4) weeks and has now closed. The marketing campaign resulted in 201 enquiries, 44 prospective purchasers requested the Due Diligence Folder and nine (9) offers in total were received. The offers received were wide ranging and reflected the unique characteristics of the site including its mixed zoning as well as the extensive earthwork requirements. The top two (2) offers sit within the valuation range set by the two independent valuers that appraised the site. The Archdiocese are now negotiating with the bidders, on behalf of the PFC, to finalise their offers and proceed to a sales contract

with the preferred purchaser. A further update will be provided once the sale has been finalised.

THE ARCHBISHOP S STATEMENT ON REFERENDUM: The Archbishop has issued a Pastoral Statement on the



Referendum:"The Referendum on the Voice brings Australia to a threshold moment, since it looks not only to our past but to our future, not only to what we have been but to what we can become. There is no doubt that Australia has achieved great things since European settlement, and that is a source of national pride. But Australians are increasingly coming to appreciate the devastation that European settlement has brought to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. The Archbishop urges everyone in the Archdiocese to prepare to vote in a way that looks to the Gospel and, whatever the result of the Referendum, to commit to redressing the chronic disadvantage suffered by the

LITURGY NOTES: THE COLLECTION In the early years of Christianity, the faithful brought bread and wine with them to church to be used in the celebration of the Eucharist. What wasn't used at the Mass was given to the poor and needy. Later, people started bringing other gifts of food or money which were offered for the work of the Church. In most parishes a collection of money is taken up during the Preparation of Gifts. This action is an integral part of the liturgy because our offering links us to the sacrifice of the cross and the money will be used in the mission of the Church.

Visitors to a Catholic Church are often surprised (and sometimes embarrassed!) when the collection plate comes around a second time at Mass, usually after Communion. Having two collections is a way of separating donations for the support of the clergy from contributions to the cost of the parish services and operations.

WITH EXPECTANT HEARTS: This year's Advent resource invites us to explore more deeply what it means to allow



God to come to birth in us. We have developed "With Expectant Hearts" to help us enter a new liturgical year, the journey of faith that stretches before us. The spiritual nourishment God seeks to give us now will come to birth in us through the entire year if we can open our hearts in response to it. This 22-day reflection resource can be used by individuals and groups. Its main purpose is to help us to find a few minutes each day to practice what it means to sit with God and to trust God to lead us forward.
