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What can work and wages, welfare and the unemployed tell us about the kingdom of God? In the parable of the labourers in the vineyard we see the extraordinary generosity and compassion of God. (Matthew 20:1-16).

There is great tragedy in unemployment, the loss of work, and the inability to earn enough to live and support oneself or one's family. In Jesus' times labourers had to wait each day in the marketplace until someone hired them for a day's job. No work that day usually meant no food on the family table.

The labourers who worked all day and received their payment complain that the master pays the late afternoon labourers the same wage. The master, undoubtedly, hired them in the late afternoon so they wouldn't go home payless and hungry. God is generous in opening the doors of his kingdom to all who will enter, both those who have laboured a life-time for him and those who come at the last hour. While the reward is the same, the motive for one's labour can make all the difference. Some work only for reward. They will only put in as much effort as they think they will get back. Others labour out of love and joy for the opportunity to work and to serve others. Jesus calls each one of us to serve God and his kingdom with joy and zeal and to serve our neighbour with a generous spirit as well.

Jesus wants to fill each one of us with the power and strength of the Holy Spirit so we can bear great fruit for God's kingdom (the fruit of peace, joy, righteousness, and love) and also bring the fruit of his kingdom to our neighbour as well. We labour for the Lord to bring him praise, honour, and glory. And we labour for our neighbour for their welfare with the same spirit of loving-kindness and compassion which the Lord has shown to us.

Paul the Apostle reminds us, "Whatever your task, work heartily, as serving the Lord

and not others, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward - you are serving the Lord Christ" (Colossians 3:23-24). Do you perform your daily tasks and responsibilities with cheerfulness and diligence for the Lord's sake? And do you give generously to others, especially to those in need of your care and support? *Fr Marty*

the vulnerable, especially refugees and migrants."


#### POPE FRANCIS' VISIT TO MARSEILLE TO PROMOTE PEACE & WELCOME:



23-24 September: The Pope will be in the southern French city from Friday to Saturday of this week, and will attend the concluding session of the Mediterranean Meetings, a Church -led initiative aiming to build community amongst the region's various peoples, religions, and cultures. The Pope will head to Marseille's Basilica of Notre Dame de-la-Garde,

where he will pray first with the clergy of the local diocese, and then with a group of professionals from various organisations . – Stella Maris, Caritas Gap- Briançon, and the Association de secours en mer – dedicated to the pastoral care of seafarers, migrants, and refugees. ST FINBARR FEAST DAY 25 September: St Finbarr was the son of an artisan and a




lady of the Irish royal court. Born in Connaught, Ireland, and baptized Lochan, he was educated at Kilmacahil, Kilkenny, where the monks named him 'Fionnbhar'r (white head) because of his light hair; he is also known as Bairre and Barr. He went on pilgrimage to Rome with some of the monks, visiting St. David in Wales on the way back.

Supposedly, on another visit to Rome the Pope wanted to consecrate him a bishop but was deterred by a vision, notifying the pope that God had reserved that honour to Himself, and Finbarr was consecrated from heaven and then returned to Ireland. At any rate, he may have preached in Scotland, definitely did

in southern Ireland, lived as a hermit on a small island at Lough Eiroe, and then, on the river Lee, founded a monastery that developed into the city of Cork, of which he was the first bishop. His monastery became famous in southern Ireland and attracted numerous disciples. Many extravagant miracles are attributed to him, and supposedly, the sun did not set for two weeks after he died at Cloyne about the year 633. *Fr Marty* 

ST VINCENT DE PAUL FEAST DAY 27 September. We celebrate today a 17th-century French saint whose love for the



poor was so great that he is called the "apostle of Charity", and he was made the patron saint of all works of charity. St Vincent was born into a poor farming family in France, and his ambition was to gain high office in the Church in order to raise the fortunes of his family. While on a voyage from Marseilles, Vincent was captured by Muslim pirates and auctioned as a slave in Tunis. His enslavement lasted two years and during that time his Master's Muslim wife questioned him about the Faith. Eventually she converted and St Vincent was able to escape in 1607. He made his way to Paris, and with the help of a spiritual director he began to undergo a gradual conversion of heart. He would eventually co-found the Daughters of Charity, young women who were mobilized to serve in hospitals, prisons, set up orphanag-

es, schools, soup kitchens, and homes for the mentally ill. Until this day their motto is "the charity of Christ impels us". *Fr Marty*

### MASTERPLAN UPDATE: Update - Old St Bernard's Sale Process.



As noted in last week's newsletter, the sales campaign for Old Saint Bernard's has now closed, with nine (9) offers received in total. The top two (2) offers received sat within the valuation range set by the two independent land value appraisals for the site. Since this time, the Archdiocese has negotiated with the bidders to clarify and improve their final offers. The process is now complete, a preferred purchaser has been selected and the finer detail of the sales contract is now being worked through. A further update

will be provided once the sale is finalised.

# LITURGY NOTES: THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER



Central to the Liturgy of the Eucharist at Mass is the Eucharistic Prayer. The priest offers this prayer on our behalf and we participate through the opening dialogue and the three acclamations, and by joining our personal praise and sacrifice to that of the Church. The following elements are included in all thirteen Eucharistic Prayers in the Missal, though the order varies:

- Thanksgiving especially in the Preface which gives thanks for the whole work of salvation or for some special aspect of it;
- **Acclamation** the "Holy, holy" sung by the people and presider after the Preface. Here we join the singing of the angels and saints before God's throne;
- **Invocation** or *epiclesis*, the calling down of the Holy Spirit on the gifts of bread and wine:
- Institution narrative the retelling of the scriptural account of Christ's words and actions at the Last Supper;
- Memorial prayer or anamnesis ('lest we forget') which recalls the paschal mystery;
- Offering the entire Church and this assembly offer Christ and themselves to God in union with Christ;
- **Second invocation** of the Spirit this time on those gathered that they may become "one body, one spirit in Christ":
- Intercessions for the Church and the world, for the living and the dead;
- **Final doxology** ("through him, with him, ...."), the prayer of praise in which the celebrant sums up and concludes the thanksgiving offered to God.



#### THE ARCHBISHOP S STATEMENT ON REFERENDUM: The Archbishop has issued a Pastoral Statement on the



Referendum:"The Referendum on the Voice brings Australia to a threshold moment, since it looks not only to our past but to our future, not only to what we have been but to what we can become. There is no doubt that Australia has achieved great things since European settlement, and that is a source of national pride. But Australians are increasingly coming to appreciate the devastation that European settlement has brought to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. The Archbishop urges everyone in the Archdiocese to prepare to vote in a way that looks to the Gospel and, whatever the result of the Referendum,

to commit to redressing the chronic disadvantage suffered by the Indigenous peoples and promoting reconciliation for the good not just of some but of the whole nation". To read the full statement go to https://brisbanecatholic.org.au/articles/a-pastoral-statement-on-the-referendum
