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ACTIONS SPEAK LOUDER THAN WORDS.

Jesus was speaking to the Israelites especially to the religious authorities. They were the first to receive the word of God through the prophets. They claimed to believe in the one and only God but their faith was mostly expressed with their lips yet their action did not align with their words. They were just like the second son in the Gospel reading. On the other hand, the so-called sinners, the prostitutes and the tax collectors. who became followers of John the Baptist and Jesus Christ, listened and repented and therefore, they had the passport to enter the Kingdom of God.



They were the first son who initially said no but eventually obeyed his father. In Matthew 15:8, Jesus quotes Isaiah 29:13 saying "These people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me." Also in Matthew 7:21-23, He specifically warns that "Not everyone who says to Me, Lord, Lord!' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of My Father in heaven." It is therefore imperative that we show our faith in God by having a heart full of compassion that eventually comes out in our actions and behavior. One thinks of those people who show off when it comes to religion. Playing to the gallery and merely calling out 'Lord Lord! 'will not carry much weight in God's eyes. Jesus teaches that true religion is rooted in doing and words are only lovely when they tally with what we do. Good actions are the clothes that faith wears.

Self-righteousness is a big hindrance to the door of eternal life. We often look down on other people with the thought that we are holier than them. Let us focus therefore on our own unworthiness and thank God for sending His only Son to redeem us. More importantly, let our words be translated into action. Better yet, let our action of loving others speak for itself. *Fr Jose*

Si ,"The Human Roots of the Ecological Crisis", examines and explores the social trends and ideologies that have caused environmental problems. It criticizes the dominant technocratic paradigm that views nature as a mere object to be manipulated and controlled by human technology. It also challenges the modern anthropocentrism that sees humans as separate from and

superior to the environment, and ignores the spiritual and transcendental value of nature. It calls for a new ecological awareness and a social conscience. This chapter is very important to understanding Pope Francis' overall account of the environmental challenges we as human family face in our common home. Pope Francis expresses his deep concern that humankind is lapsing into a collective relativism, a system of loosely held ideas where there are no real boundaries to human actions. Let's find a new synthesis which will put human beings in the correct relationship with creation. *Fr Jose*

POPES NEW LETTER TO BE TITLED LAUDATE DEUM: Pope Francis' new letter on the



environment will be titled Laudate Deum (Praise God), a frequent refrain in several psalms, including Psalm 148, which tells the heavens, angels, sun and the moon to praise the Lord. The new document, to be released on October 4, is what the Pope has described as a follow-up to his 2015 encyclical Laudato

LITURGY NOTES: THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER



Central to the Liturgy of the Eucharist at Mass is the Eucharistic Prayer. The priest offers this prayer on our behalf and we participate through the opening dialogue and the three acclamations, and by joining our personal praise and sacrifice to that of the Church. The following elements are included in all thirteen Eucharistic Prayers in the Missal, though the order varies:

- **Thanksgiving -** especially in the Preface which gives thanks for the whole work of salvation or for some special aspect of it;
- Acclamation the "Holy, holy" sung by the people and presider after the Preface. Here we join the singing of the angels and saints before God's throne;
- Invocation or epiclesis, the calling down of the Holy Spirit on the gifts of bread and wine;
- Institution narrative the retelling of the scriptural account of Christ's words and actions at the Last Supper;
- Memorial prayer or anamnesis ('lest we forget') which recalls the paschal mystery;
- Offering the entire Church and this assembly offer Christ and themselves to God in union with Christ;
- **Second invocation** of the Spirit this time on those gathered that they may become "one body, one spirit in Christ":
- Intercessions for the Church and the world, for the living and the dead;
- **Final doxology** ("through him, with him,"), the prayer of praise in which the celebrant sums up and concludes the thanksgiving offered to God.
