

Sour grapes, or lush fruit?

This parable is strange. Parables do get us thinking.

The landowner who sets up the vineyard and leaves all to the lessees is extravagantly trusting.

The tenants certainly abused the abundant trust put in them. We are incredulous that the tenants would think they could take over the inheritance by murdering the heir. There is a lot of violence.

The listeners are hooked into the story in response to the question, 'when the owner comes, what will he do to those tenants?'

Jesus flips metaphors to rejected stones and keystones which we can understand. But, 'this is the Lord's doing and it is wonderful to see?' That can again have us scratching our heads.

The parable is unfinished, as they always are. Do the listeners change their ways? How are we accepting the kingdom and producing fruit? Are we marvelling at the ways of God in our lives?
