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There are some fascinating cultural details in this gospel reading that show a typical Jewish exchange taking place. The Pharisees set out to trap Jesus. They were joined by others whose goals were political, but also religiously motivated. They too were opposed to the teachings of Jesus. The group used flattery in an attempt to take Jesus off guard believing they had the perfect

'Gotcha' that would embarrass Jesus. If he says it's not right to pay taxes to Caesar, they will accuse him of disloyalty to Rome. If he says 'yes' pay taxes to Caesar they will accuse him of kowtowing to the occupier and betraying his own people. Their malice is transparent, but Jesus did not live and act to satisfy the expectations of others.

Jesus takes an unexpected turn and asks for the coin of tribute. We are familiar with Jesus's 'king-hit' answer. If the image is that of Caesar then he must own the coin, so give it back to him. And in like manner, give back to God what is God's. This is a perfect response. It dodges the issue by avoiding a simple yes or no reply, but confounds the questioners.

In this episode Matthew is showing that Jesus is way beyond the categories into which people tried to slot him. He really compels us to meditate on his person and his message. Do we know him well enough to quote and live by some of his key sayings that relate to wholeness and growth? It is worth recalling that his whole spiritual approach is to see the divine in others and the world around us. Religion is not the main focus. In fact, he boils it all down to, 'Do I reach out to others?' Do I feed the hungry, give water to the thirsty, clothe the naked, visit the sick, support those imprisoned by physical or mental illness? Life's persistent and most urgent question is, 'What are you doing for others?' *Fr Marty*

MASTERPLAN UPDATE: Kennedy Terrace: A contract of sale has been executed for



the property. Handover will occur mid-December 2023. It is the Parish's understanding that the dance studio lease will be retained until the lease expires in 2024. There is future intent for the rear portion of the property on Lizzie Street to be utilised for detached residential dwellings. Future intent

for the former brick church building is not known. The parish will be informed if any further information comes to light.

Jubilee Master Plan: A response to Council's draft approval conditions was submitted to Council two weeks ago. We are ever hopeful that we will receive Council's finalised approval conditions for the master plan within the next month. An update will be given again once the final approval is received.

There are many photos of classes and school events shown in the book for remembrance and celebration. STATEMENT ON THE VOTE Archbishop Coleridge: Excerpts from his statement. "One

thing is clear: the nation is more divided than ever and in many ways. It's ironic that a process supposed to unite the nation has done just the opposite. There's an urgent need now to create a new kind of national unity, and that can't be left to the politicians, because there's more to this than politics. The task belongs to all of us.

A second thing is still clearer and more urgent: the search for reconciliation based on truth and justice must continue.... It's up to all of us to ensure that what we do from here serves national unity and racial justice, because we'll never have the first unless we have the second". MIDDLE EAST: Warning against a humanitarian catastrophe in Gaza and ongoing conflicts elsewhere, Pope Francis has called for a day of fasting, penance and prayer for peace in the world on Friday, October 27. "War does not solve any problems, it only sows death and destruction. It increases hatred, multiplies revenge. War erases the future," "Our thoughts go to Palestine and Israel," he said to applause.

"Casualties are rising and the situation in Gaza is desperate. Please, may everything possible be done to avoid a humanitarian catastrophe."

"Please," he said, "let us continue to pray for peace in the world, especially in tormented Ukraine", a tragedy that is no longer talked about but continues.

"Silence the weapons. Listen to the cry of the poor, the people, the children, for peace.".

He urged all people of faith to take "just one side in this conflict: that of peace. But not with words, with prayer, with total dedication." Our parish mass at Bardon 9am Friday 27 October will join in this prayer for peace.

AFGHANISTAN EARTHQUAKE: Caritas Australia has launched an appeal for Afghanistan following two earthquakes that struck the country last week, killing more than 2000 people. Buildings have been damaged and destroyed, and hospitals overwhelmed, with this natural disaster compounding decades of crises in Afghanistan.

Caritas Australia is supporting its partners on the ground as they respond to the urgent need for emergency shelters, clean water, medical supplies, and food and other essentials.

Economic collapse, political instability and long-term drought had already left 24.4 million people in Afghanistan in need of urgent humanitarian assistance - 97 per cent of the population were already being pushed into extreme poverty, with two-thirds of households finding it difficult to meet basic food and non-food needs. THE COMMUNION RITE: The Rite of Communion is the culmination of the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The elements that

make up the rite are:

Lord's Prayer - this is one part of the Mass in which everyone participates fully, consciously and actively. Sign of Peace - a symbolic gesture of imparting to others the blessing of Christ's peace. We share the sign of peace deliberately and sincerely with those around us.

Breaking of the Bread - the name by which the Eucharist was first known, it signifies that the many faithful are made one body through the Body of Christ which is broken and shared. The 'Lamb of God' is sung until the breaking and pouring (Fraction Rite) are complete.

Communion Procession and Receiving Communion - we walk together to the Lord's Table where we share the paschal meal with Christ and with one another as fellow members of the body of Christ.

Communion Song – this begins while the priest is receiving the Sacrament and continues for as long as the Sacrament is being administered to the faithful. We sing together to express our spiritual union as members of the one body of Christ. Silence - a time of quiet is observed after all have received Communion. This is the time to give thanks and to pray for the strength to be bread for our world of family, work, and community in the days ahead.

Prayer after Communion - the presider brings together the individual prayers of the assembly, praying that the Eucharist will be effective in their lives.

SYNOD ON SYNODALITY: Broken Bay Bishop Anthony Randazzo says synodality is "not something that is born in a vacuum" but is how Catholics "live our faith and how we proclaim the Gospel in every single moment of our day". Bishop Randazzo was speaking at a media briefing along with Australia professor Renee Kohler-Ryan and others.

> After close to two weeks of discussion - including on issues such as synodality itself, the role of women in the Church, welcome for LGBTQ Catholics, better education and formation of Catholics and more collaborative relationships between priests and laypeople, "there is a sense that things are tightening up, emerg-

ing, but through that process of hopeful patience," Australian Professor Kohler-Ryan said.

Professor Kohler-Ryan insisted that the Synod discussions, including about women, are much broader than the media would have people believe. She said the discussion about women is not focused on the possibility of women deacons, but on a myriad of issues related to their lives in the Church and the world, including supporting their families and educating their children in the faith.
