MARTIN OF TOURS FEAST DAY 11 November: St Martin of Tours was born about 335 into a pagan family. He was a soldier in the Roman army until his conversion to Christianity. In 360 he joined St Hilary at Poitiers. He became a missionary in the Balkan Peninsula and, after being forced out, later founded the first monastery in Gaul, at Liguge. In 372 he was made Bishop of Tours, where he founded another monastery, Marmoutier. Martin remained an active missionary, fighting heresy, spreading Christianity. He acquired a reputation as a miracle worker and was one of the first nonmartyrs to be publicly venerated as a saint. Fr Marty

PRAY FOR PEACE. Pope Francis has called for a ceasefire in the Holy Land, especially in Gaza where a humanitarian catastrophe has unfolded, and for the release of Israeli hostages held by Hamas.



Pope Francis quoted Fr Ibrahim Faltas, the Egyptian Franciscan vicar of the Custody of the Holy Land in Jerusalem, who recently spoke on the Italian television program A Sua Immagine . "I listened to him and he said 'cease fire, cease fire'," explained the Pontiff. "We too, like Fr Ibrahim, say 'cease fire', stop, brothers and sisters: war is always a defeat – always, always!"

SYNOD ON SYNODALITY: At the Synod on Synodality's closing Mass, Pope Francis said God's love cannot be confined



"to our own agenda". "We may have plenty of good ideas on how to reform the Church, but let us remember: to adore God and to love our brothers and sisters with his love, that is the great and perennial reform."

The Pope's homily marked the closing of the month-long 2023 Synod on Synodality assembly, where 365 delegates discussed and voted on more than 80 proposals for how to become a more "synodal Church".

"Today we do not see the full fruit of this process, but with farsightedness, we look to the horizon opening up before us. The Lord will guide us and help us to be a more synodal and more missionary Church, a Church that adores God and serves the women and men of our time, going forth to bring to everyone the consoling joy of the Gospel," Francis added.The assembly's discussions set the stage for a year-long period of reflection that will culminate in the second and final synod assembly in late 2024 on the same topic.

THE COMMUNION RITE: The Rite of Communion is the culmination of the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The elements that make up the rite are:

Lord's Prayer – this is one part of the Mass in which everyone participates fully, consciously and actively.

Sign of Peace – a symbolic gesture of imparting to others the blessing of Christ's peace. We share the sign of peace deliberately and sincerely with those around us.

Breaking of the Bread – the name by which the Eucharist was first known, it signifies that the many faithful are made one body through the Body of Christ which is broken and shared. The 'Lamb of God' is sung until the breaking and pouring (Fraction Rite) are complete.

Communion Procession and **Receiving Communion** - we walk together to the Lord's Table where we share the paschal meal with Christ and with one another as fellow members of the body of Christ.

Communion Song – this begins while the priest is receiving the Sacrament and continues for as long as the Sacrament is being administered to the faithful. We sing together to express our spiritual union as members of the one body of Christ. **Silence** – a time of quiet is observed after all have received Communion. This is the time to give thanks and to pray for the strength to be bread for our world of family, work, and community in the days ahead.

Prayer after Communion – the presider brings together the individual prayers of the assembly, praying that the Eucharist will be effective in their lives.
