

In today's reading from the Gospel of Mark, we encounter the figure of John the Baptist, whose mission was to call people to repentance and pave the way for the Savior. He preached a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, and his message resonated with many people who were seeking spiritual renewal. John's call to repentance is as relevant today as it was in his time. We are all called to examine our hearts, turn away from sin, and prepare for the coming of Christ. Now, as we prepare for the celebration of Christmas, let us take this opportunity to reflect on our lives and make any necessary changes so that we can welcome Christ into our hearts.

John calls attention to the need for humility and transformation. He recognizes that he is not the Messiah, but rather a humble servant preparing for the coming of the one who is greater than he. In our own lives, we can strive to be humble and recognize our need for transformation. We cannot allow pride or self-centeredness to hinder our ability to prepare for the coming of Christ.

As we reflect on John's message, we are reminded of the importance of living lives that bear witness to the love and compassion of Christ. We are called to be agents of change in our world, bringing hope, healing, and reconciliation to those around us. Just as John's message challenged the status quo of his time, we are called to challenge the injustices and inequalities that we see around us, working to create a world that more closely resembles the kingdom of God.

Remembering John's example and his call to repentance and transformation, let us be mindful of the ways in which we can be agents of change in our world, bringing hope and healing to those in need.

Let us pray. Lord, we thank you for the example of John the Baptist, who prepared the way for the coming of your Son. Help us to heed his call to repentance and transformation, and to live lives that reflect your love and compassion. Give us the strength and courage to challenge injustice and to be agents of change in our world. We ask this in the name of your Son, Jesus Christ. Amen. **Fr Jose**

Today marks the 75th anniversary of one of the world's most groundbreaking global pledges: the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR). This landmark document enshrines the inalienable rights that everyone is entitled to as a human being - regardless of race, colour, religion, sex, language, political or other opinion, national or social origin, property, birth or other status.

HANUKKAH is an eight-day Jewish celebration that commemorates the rededication during the second century B.C. of the Second Temple in Jerusalem. According to legend, Jews had risen up against their Greek-Syrian oppressors in the Maccabean Revolt. Hanukkah, which means "dedication" in Hebrew, begins on the 25th of Kislev on the Hebrew calendar and usually falls in November or December. This year it began Thursday evening, December 7, and continues through Friday, December 15. Often called the Festival of Lights, it is celebrated with the lighting of the menorah.

JOHN OF THE CROSS, OCD Feast Day 14 December. (1542 -1591) He was a



Spanish Catholic priest, mystic, and a Carmelite friar. He is a major figure of the Counter-Reformation in Spain. John of the Cross is known for his writings. He was mentored by and corresponded with the older Carmelite, Teresa of Ávila. Both his poetry and his studies on the development of the soul are considered the summit

of mystical Spanish literature and among the greatest works of all <u>Spanish literature</u>. Verse 4 of *The Living Flame of Love*

How gently and lovingly
you wake in my heart,
where in secret you dwell alone;
and in your sweet breathing,
filled with good and glory,
how tenderly you swell my heart with love.

AN INVITATION TO MERCY: The Sacrament of Penance or the Rite of Reconciliation is



an opportunity for us to be reconciled with God. No-one is perfect and we all slip up from time to time, but, through reconciliation, we can admit our failings to God and make amends.

THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO MARK (E Harrington)

2024 is year B in the three-year Gospel cycle, the year of Mark. Although the new liturgical year begins on the first Sunday of Advent, 3 December this year, not much will be heard of Mark in coming weeks because stories from Matthew, Luke and John that are not in Mark's Gospel are read during Advent and Christmas.

Mark's account is succinct and fast-moving. Unlike Matthew and Luke, it does not begin with the birth of Jesus but with his baptism as an adult. Because Mark's Gospel is so brief, there is not enough material to 'fill up' the entire year. For five weeks, from the 17th to the 21st Sunday, it is supplemented with passages from chapter 6 of the Gospel of John.

Matthew is the first gospel in the bible because when the New Testament was formed it was believed to be the oldest of the four. Since the Gospels of Matthew and Luke clearly draw heavily on the text of Mark, it is now accepted that Mark's Gospel was written first.

Mark's main interest is the person of Jesus himself. He follows Jesus through his public ministry in Galilee, outside Galilee and finally in Jerusalem immediately before the passion. The question "Who is this Jesus?" dominates the first half of Mark's Gospel. Mark depicts Jesus as a teacher with a special type of authority, a miracle worker, and a healer, someone who is the fulfilment of the ancient promise of a Messiah, though different from what his contemporaries expected of a Messiah.


