Advent into Christmas:

The gospel for the fourth Sunday of Advent is the angel Gabriel's annunciation to Mary. There is God's surprising greeting to Mary and request for her to participate in God's saving the world. Mary asks the reasonable question, "How can this be?"

The explanation: because God's Spirit is at

work. God and Gabriel pause for Mary's response.

Mary says, "yes," even though she does not entirely understand what it all means. Her story is our story.

At our Christmas masses, we hear different perspectives on the incarnation. God being born into the world as a fragile baby. There is ancestry (the story is long in the making), Caesar, no accommodation, shepherds (power interfacing with poverty and fringe dwellers), angels, signs and praising God. Shepherds go to check it out. Experiences treasured in hearts.

SOLEMNITY OF MARY - 1 JANUARY 2024



The Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God is a feast day of the Blessed Virgin Mary under the aspect of her motherhood of Jesus Christ. When Catholics celebrate the Solemnity of Mary Mother of God we are not only honoring Mary, who was chosen among all women throughout history to bear God incarnate, but we are also honoring our Lord, who is fully God and fully human. Calling Mary "mother of God" is the highest honor we can give Mary.

There will be Masses on this day. A 6.30am at St Brigid's and a 9.00am at Sacred Heart.

CELEBRATING CHRISTMAS: From the beginning, the Christian Church has understood that Christmas is more than just



the commemoration of Jesus' birth on 25th December. For nearly 2000 years, Christians have celebrated Christmas from December 25 through to the Epiphany. The church calendar today extends this celebration until the feast of the Baptism of the Lord

Christmas in fact celebrates the beginnings of the mystery of salvation – Christ's birth, his revelation to the Jewish shepherds and the Gentile magi, his baptism by John in the Jordan and his first miracle – the changing of water into wine at the wedding feast in Cana.

While it is natural to focus on Christ's nativity at Christmas time, we should not stop there. When we celebrate someone's birthday, we reflect on the life of that person in its entirety, not the day of their birth. Similarly at Christmas we remember not just Christ's birth, but his life, death and resurrection and what it means for us.

Christmas is above all a celebration of the fact that, through the Incarnation, God is present in our everyday lives. The Christ whom we adore at Christmas is no longer the infant in the manger; he is the risen Lord of the universe. Christmas celebrates not only the light of the star over Bethlehem, but Christ as the light of the world. *E Harrington*.

THE WORLD DAY OF PEACE 1 JANUARY 2024



The Vatican has published Pope Francis' Message for the 57th World Day of Peace, to be celebrated on January 1, 2024, with the theme "Artificial Intelligence and Peace." The Holy Father's Message was released on December 14, at a conference given at the Holy See Press Office.

The Pope's Message, divided into eight sections, examines the question of the progress of science and technology as a path to peace and reflects on the future of artificial intelligence (AI). The Pope also encourages that the ethical dimensions of AI, including issues of privacy, prejudice, and impact on human dignity, be addressed in the sphere of education and in the development of international law.

FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY



On Sunday 31st December we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. The Holy Family, of course, refers to Jesus, Mary and Joseph.

Many people in today's world can relate to the trials and anxieties experienced by the Holy Family. An emperor's edict compelled Mary and Joseph to travel from Nazareth to Bethlehem; a king's cruelty forced the family to flee into Egypt; fear of Herod's successor made them move from Judaea and settle in Galilee. Mary and Joseph experienced the anguish of their son's disappearance for three days in a strange and bustling city.

Through these difficult and stressful times, the Holy Family placed themselves in God's hands and followed where God called them to go.

The Son of God experienced all human conditions, including being subjected to the rulers of this world and the perils of human existence. Despite this, in fact because of it, he accomplished the will of his Father and the work of salvation. In the same way, it is not by fleeing reality that we find God. God is to be found in the ups and down, the joys and sorrows, of family life. The prayers of the feast ask God to 'help us live as Jesus, Mary and Joseph, in peace with you and one another'. *E Harrington*


