

Weddings and Wine: Weddings are celebrations of new beginnings. Wedding Cana has lots of questions. Where is the bride and bridegroom? The bridegroom is the one supposed to supply the drinks. Why does Jesus step in? What was Mary thinking when she asks the question? Why is there no tale of the actual transformation of the wine? The steward doesn't have much of a clue. Why don't the servants speak up? What happens at the celebration with this 'best wine'???

Soooo: weddings are love stories and new beginnings. How is that so here/ for us?

John the evangelist gives some clues. With Jesus' 'signs' in John's gospel there is always more than what is at the surface. Isaiah (first reading) promises that God will 'marry' his people.

For the people the wine (life) has run out? Is this the fresh start?

Disciples see and understand.

This is a 'first' in Jesus, as in the style of what is to come.

The introduction says this happens on the third day. There is another 'third day' at the end of the gospel. Is this where the best wine slakes all thirsts? *Fr Gerry*

Fresh beginning: The church year began in Advent. We have now come through the Christmas Season. We begin Ordinary Time. Ordinary time is so named by the ordinal number that is used to designate each of the Sundays as in Second, Third, Fourth and so on. This weekend is the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time. We will continue this way until 2 March which is Ash Wednesday. The colour returns to green.

The Sunday readings are for Year C and normally follow Luke's Gospel. Today to confuse you the Church has John's Gospel chapter 2: 1-11.

Weekdays is Year 2 so Monday's Gospel is Mark 2: 18-22. Psalter is also Week 2.

Hopefully you are now back on track!!
