### A prophet for All

Remember when following Christ as a signed up member of the one true church, one of the chosen, the select, was being part of the "in" crowd. Just follow the rules and premium seats in heaven are assured, because Jesus came to save us. Yes, he did but.....

In today's gospel, Luke recounts Jesus speaking in the Synagogue, in his hometown. The Jews recognise him as one of their own – the "son of Joseph, surely" – and accept and approve of this local boy as a rising prophet. Until that is, he starts to say things they do not want to hear. Jesus tells them that the great prophets were not the sole province of the Jews – God sent the prophets for the hearing and benefit of all, even those outside the Jewish faith that all may come to know Him. This news enraged everyone in the synagogue and now this local boy was no prophet, but fit to be run off a cliff. After all, what would he know – this son of Joseph?

Since its inception the catholic (or universal) church, which Jesus Christ established on his "rock" Peter, has been politicised, fought over and fought against. In 14th and 15th centuries for example you could be executed for not belonging to the catholic church or alternatively executed for belonging to it, depending on who reigned at the time and where you lived. You could be tortured until you said you were faithful to the catholic church, or excommunicated if you were deemed unworthy of being a member. Membership being critically important to survival both before and after death. But Jesus did not establish his universal church as a club which you could join – or not. He established it as a means of spreading the Good News of the Gospel, that is: we are saved and loved, to ALL. This is the fundamental mission of the catholic church and as catholics we must be ready to spread that news to all so that all may share in the glory of the risen Christ.

The Irish government has added a new public holiday to their national calendar to honour the country's female patron, St. Brigid of Kildare. The fifth-century abbess is one of Ireland's patron saints. Her compassion and generosity feature as outstanding elements of her character. In Kildare she joined a monastery that had both men and women, eventually becoming the Abbess. This gave life to the foundation of a community of dedicated women. Brigid has always been looked upon as the initiator and abbess of the first women's religious community among the Irish. **Volunteers and Vaccinations** Thank you to the many volunteers who helped make the Christmas season at Jubilee Parish run so smoothly. With so many Masses and other celebrations over Christmas, the commitment required by volunteers increases and it's a credit to you all that everything went so smoothly during this busy time.

A major topic that keeps cropping up in the news and day to day life is COVID-19 vaccinations. Every parish has been asked by the Archdiocese to ensure that volunteers who carry out parish work with children or vulnerable adults or in homes, workplaces, hospitals or other health care settings, are fully vaccinated. Typical volunteer roles that require vaccination include:

- Administration work in parish office,
- Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion who attend to the sick in hospitals or private residence, Hospital Chaplains, Outreach - Homeless Support including children
- Safeguarding Local Officer, Youth Co-ordinator
- Ministries involving children such as: Catechists, Leaders of Children's Liturgy of the Word, Sacramental Coordinators and Altar Server Coordinators



If you are involved in any of these roles, your local Safeguarding Coordinator will be in touch with you directly to provide evidence of your vaccination in the form of a COVID-19 Digital Vaccination Certificate or an Immunisation History Statement. Or you can forward your certificate to me directly at [lsr.jubilee@bne.catholic.net.au](mailto:lsr.jubilee@bne.catholic.net.au). Feel free to cross out your Individual Healthcare Identifier before sending through your certificate, if you wish. Proof of vaccination is not required for other volunteer roles that are purely domestic, social, recreational, religious, or private in nature, including Mass (e.g. Ministers of the Word or Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion at Mass).
