Greetings to all,

In last Sunday's gospel we heard Jesus' discourse to the disciples, Luke's version of the Beatitudes. Today's gospel continues this discourse with the same seemingly paradoxical, even absurd, directives for his followers. We are to love our enemies, do good to those who hate us, pray for those who treat us badly, to turn the other cheek to those who strike us, to give to others without any hope or expectation of a return, not to condemn but to forgive others.

More fundamental even, than this high ideal of how we are to relate to others, is how God relates to us. We are to relate to others in all these ways because that is how God relates to us.

As the gospel reading says, God is merciful and compassionate; he is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. God has loved us in an extraordinary way in the person of Jesus and we are to relate to each other out of that tremendous grace that we have been given.

The gospel reading also declares that in giving as we have received, we open our hearts to receive even more from God. 'Give, and there will be gifts for you'. We give out of what we have received and our giving opens us up to receive even more.



2022 Theme: Achieving Social Justice through Formal Employment

More than 60 per cent of the world's employed population, that is 2 billion women, men and youth, earn their livelihoods in the informal economy. The COVID-19 pandemic has put a spotlight on the vulnerability of workers in the informal economy.

Informal workers, who often lack any form of social protection or employment-related benefits, are twice as likely to be poor compared to formal workers. Most people enter the informal economy not by choice, but due to lack of opportunities in the formal economy. Promoting the transition to formal employment is a necessary condition to



The joy of social justice Fr Andrew Hamilton SJ 11 February 2022

We can easily allow social justice to be something we are vaguely in favour of, but not a priority in our lives. The World Day of Social Justice (20th February) will then disappear into the mist of innumerable worthy days and weeks. If our own lives are going smoothly, we might like people who are discriminated against to be properly treated, but we do not agitate for the social change that will make that happen. At election time we think first of how the competing party policies will benefit or hurt ourselves and whether they can be trusted to implement their promises. Only then will we ask whether they will make Australia a more just nation.

During the time of coronavirus we have glimpsed ways in which a just society might work and how attractive it might be. We felt encouraged when people did not pursue their own gain but accepted restrictions on their freedom to keep other people safe, when neighbours called in on the elderly to ensure they were well, when governments supported the homeless and the unemployed, and when individuals went out of their way to build local community instead of

brooding on what they had lost. The face of social justice was no longer dutiful and careworn but happy.

Seen from this perspective a passion for social justice grows when we recognise the value of each human being and our mutual dependence, and also find delight in generosity and reaching out to people on the edge of our society. It involves more than a well worked-out plan for society and a social philosophy. It comes alive when people cheerfully

St Joseph's is a school that has a special love of all things literature. This week, while many of you would have been celebrating St Valentine's Day, we were celebrating Library Lovers Day, which also falls on 14 February. Our students are very fortunate to have an extremely well stocked Library with three very knowledgeable staff, two Teacher Librarians and a library assistant. Between them they can meet the needs of any reader from reluctant to an avid reader, the fussy and the undecided. Our library is such a hive of activity that we call it the *Active Learning Centre* (ALC) and it is physically located in the middle of our school, or should I say, in the 'heart' of our school. Our Joey's borrow books every week at timetabled sessions and the ALC is open at other times for those who need an extra supply of books. More evidence of the value we place on literature and reading is each year the P & F donate a St Joseph's library bag to our upcoming Preps. St Joseph's also includes a book in the library bag, (because a library bag is no use without a book!) The Preps then have this book to read and share over the Christmas break ready to bring along to school in the new year.
