Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

Every year on Palm Sunday, we remember not just a historical drama but take part in Jesus' life, death and resurrection as it happens today.

His entry into the city begins on a huge wave of optimism, joy, and hope. The people line the streets waving palms and placing their cloaks on the ground as they shout His name. This was an ancient Roman tradition used to welcome soldiers home after their success in battle. The crowd welcome Jesus in a similar way as they shout out, Hosanna, Hosanna, blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord. These same people who were happy to welcome Him with shouts of joy, will soon begin to shout, 'Crucify Him, Crucify Him.' Jesus is alone, betrayed and denied by even His closest friends.

Whilst celebrating this week with dignity and reverence, we also need to ask ourselves who and where we are in the crowds. Where am I as Jesus passes by on the donkey? Am I in the crowd shouting out his name? When, like Judas, have I betrayed others or Jesus? When, like Peter, have I denied knowing Jesus? Am I like Pilate when I judge and condemn others? How am I like Simon or Veronica who help Jesus in his time of need? Having welcomed Jesus with joy, will I stand with the same people spitting out insults as I shout 'Crucify Him! Crucify Him!'

This week we offer our prayers to decide what kind of followers of Christ we are going to be. *Sinead*

PALM SUNDAY – 28TH MARCH 2021 (YEAR B)

Proper of the Mass

First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7 **Second Reading:** Philippians 2:6-11

Response: My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?

Gospel Acclamation: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory! Christ became obedient for us even to death, dying on the cross. Therefore God raised him on high and gave him a name above all other names. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory!

Gospel: Mark 15:1-39



Protocols:

- Normally the assembly gathers outside the church door and processes into the liturgical space on Palm Sunday (carrying branches) and the Easter Vigil (carrying candles). There is **no problem** with people **taking a branch or candle from a common basket** at the church door. A problem could occur with the

procession into the church and suitable distancing being maintained. This may be an issue if the doorways are quite narrow and a bottleneck is likely to occur.

On Palm Sunday, the Missal gives an option for the blessing of palms inside the church without a procession. Within Jubilee Parish both options will be used. It depends on the particular church.

This option is not available at the Easter Vigil, because a bonfire is not possible inside.

- There is no issue with the washing of the feet on Holy Thursday. While not related to Covid, multiple towels might be more hygienic. The rite does not require the number twelve.
- For the Veneration of the Cross on Good Friday, people are invited to bow or genuflect to reverence the cross, but should not touch it or kiss it. It may be helpful to locate the cross where people cannot get close enough to touch it.
- There is no issue with sprinkling the assembly with water at the Easter Vigil or at Easter Masses.
- Where Easter Eggs are distributed to children after Masses, they should be handed out to them one by one, rather than have children take their own from a common basket. The usual rules apply for refreshments after the Easter Vigil or Easter Masses (in general, no shared condiments and no self-service).



The Sacrament of Reconciliation The Second Rite: Tuesday night 30 March at 7pm at St Joan of Arc Church Clyde Rd Herston there will be a celebration of the Second Rite of Reconciliation.

The Second Rite of Reconciliation has a communal gathering, listening to the Word and individual confession. There will be four priests available for people to confess to. The individual confession within this Rite is brief. (If the penitent wishes to have a longer conversation with the priest then the First Rite is the form where this is best done. Parishioners can still phone the office and make a time to celebrate the First Rite.) The Second Rite is drawn together with a short conclusion as

we rejoice in God's mercy. "For God does not cease to spurt us on to possess a more abundant life and, being rich in mercy, constantly offers pardon and calls on sinners to trust in God's forgiveness." *Eucharistic Prayer for Reconciliation 1.*
