## Third Sunday of Easter



**Jesus encounters:** Today's gospel tells of how Jesus encountered his disciples. He simply walks with them, opens the scripture to them, and eats with them. Jesus encounters them. How does Jesus encounter us?

To encounter someone implies a relationship with that person that is special in its depth. How well the disciples knew Jesus, but now he is coming to them at an even deeper level of intimacy. Jesus encounters us, and we him, in

the ordinary events of our lives. As he approaches us as we are with our ups and downs, our grace and sin, we are changed by the encounter. Thus, encounters with him are covered with care, concern, forgiveness and love beyond measure.

We encounter him in others, those who love us and we them. We encounter him in the community of faith that gathers to celebrate the Eucharist and the other sacraments. To celebrate Easter is to be attentive to the many ways that Jesus encounters us, in the poor, the sick, the needy, those who treat us with care and invite us to deeper love in all the events of our human life. Let this Easter season help us to encounter Jesus and his people in need. *Fr Rony*

**WORLD LEADERS GLOBAL SUMMIT ON CLIMATE CHANGE**  
Climate change is one of the big challenges facing the world today. Pope Francis says in *Laudato Si*; “The urgent challenge to protect our common home includes a concern to bring the whole human family together to seek a sustainable and integral development, for we know that

things can change. The Creator does not abandon us; he never forsakes his loving plan or repents of having created us. Humanity still has the ability to work together in building our common home. I want to recognize, encourage and thank all those striving in countless ways to guarantee the protection of the home which we share.” Jo Biden, President of the USA took action on his first day in office to return the country to the Paris Agreement. Later he invited 40 world leaders to a virtual Summit which will be held on April 22 and 23. The Leaders’ Summit on Climate will underscore the need for, and the economic benefits of stronger climate action. The Summit will highlight examples of how enhanced climate action can create good paying jobs, advance innovative technologies, and help vulnerable countries adapt to climate impacts. We do have a mission to reserve our common home in its beauty. So, let us pray for this global summit and for world leaders to bring forth new measures to care for our Mother Earth.

**ANZAC DAY:** Liturgically no solemnity or commemoration can take precedence over a Sunday of the Easter season. Therefore the Anzac Day Mass cannot be celebrated this year as April 25 is the Fourth Sunday of Easter and the prayers and scriptural readings of the day take precedence over those set down for Anzac Day. The texts are very appropriate for this special day of remembrance.

Anzac Day will be suitably acknowledged in the liturgy through the choice of hymns, the homily and the prayers of intercession.

The 1998 Apostolic Letter *Dies Domini* states this clearly in its first paragraph:

“Sunday recalls the day of Christ’s resurrection. It is Easter which returns week by week, celebrating Christ’s victory over sin and death, the fulfilment in him of the first creation and the dawn of the ‘new creation’.”

The Church assembles for Eucharist on Sunday to celebrate something profound and fundamental – the paschal mystery. Within this celebration we acknowledge the significant realities of our lives.



**Jubilee Parish Master Plan:** The Parish has developed a long-term property master plan for some of our sites in Paddington, Herston and Petrie Terrace. The aim of this plan is to help continue the mission of the Church, manage the assets effectively and in a financially sustainable manner, while responding to changing demands of our congregation and community. We are working with our planning consultants, Ethos Urban, to lodge a development application that will allow us to

start delivering on opportunities envisaged for these sites. There are and have been a lot of stages to get to where we are at present. The next phase is called community engagement. Over the coming weeks another consultation process will start with you, key stakeholders and the wider community, to gain further feedback on the proposed possible developments. 
## BRISBANE MARCH FOR LIFE RALLY— SATURDAY MAY 8, 2021

Meet at Speakers' Corner, Parliament House, corner Alice and George Streets, Brisbane, at 2:30pm for COVID check-in. 3pm rally. After the rally, a March for Life around the Brisbane CBD, concluding at Speakers' Corner. This year we are specifically rallying and marching for:



- \* Protesting the abortion-to-birth laws passed in 2018, and the tragic result of a 58% increase in abortions in Queensland.
- \* Petitioning the Federal Government to allow the Human Rights (Children Born Alive Protection) Bill 2021 to go to a vote this year.
- \* Petitioning the state government to urgently increase palliative care funding and against legalising assisted suicide in Queensland.
- \* Protesting the fact that sex-selective abortions are occurring in Queensland.

As always it will be a family-friendly event, and Queensland Police will have a presence to help ensure our safety at all times. This event is organised by Cherish Life QLD.



### ONLINE LECTURE ON LITURGY: MONSIGNOR KEVIN IRWIN

On Monday May 17, 2021 the ACU Centre for Liturgy is presenting an online public lecture by Monsignor Professor Kevin W Irwin on “Liturgy and Sacraments in a COVID World: Renewal not Restoration”.

In the lecture Msgr Kevin Irwin will highlight a positive path forward through the challenge of problematic liturgical practices that have been uncovered during the pandemic, where parishes have used technology to connect to their communities. While some successful innovations have emerged during this period, further work is still needed in many places to implement Vatican II's liturgical reforms fully.

Monsignor Irwin held the Walter J. Schmitz Chair of Liturgical Studies (2000-2015) at Catholic University of America. He is currently their Ordinary Research Professor. He is the author of over twenty books and seventy journal articles.

The public lecture will run from 10am-11:30am AEST 17 May via Zoom.
