Cathedral of St Stephen 150th Anniversary Message Stick

The Message Stick, an ancient and culturally significant instrument of welcome and acceptance, has been travelling around the Archdiocese of Brisbane.

This journey heralds the 150th Anniversary of the completion and opening of the Cathedral of St Stephen on the sacred lands of the First Nations Peoples of Meanjin Brisbane.

The Message Stick holds an invitation for parishioners across the Archdiocese to come together on Pentecost Sunday, May 19, 2024, at the Cathedral to celebrate this momentous occasion. It has been welcomed to our schools and will be acknowledged at our weekend masses. We will join in the following prayer written by Archbishop Mark Coleridge.



PRAYER FOR THE SESQUICENTENARY OF THE CATHEDRAL OF ST STEPHEN

*Down by the river, heavenly Father,
on this earth our mother,
where children of the Dreaming

Response: The Lord has revealed to the nations his saving power.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, Alleluia! All who love me will keep my words, and my Father will love them and we will come to them. Alleluia!

Gospel: John 15:9-17

Love is the heartbeat of today's gospel and second reading. As disciples, we are called to feel this pulse and make our lives beat in rhythm with it. The love commandment that Jesus gives to disciples depends on God's limitless love for the world. This love is made incarnate and dwells among us in Jesus, the one who is 'close to the Father's heart.' Jesus' relationship with his Father, his own life and death, become the norm of the love of disciples.



One of the most priceless human gifts is friendship. It allows us to reveal our inner reality and receive from another in openness and trust. With a friend we can think aloud. With a friend we participate in one another's joys and sorrows, hopes and fears. With a friend we navigate our rough and stormy realities.

In today's gospel, Jesus calls disciples by the most precious of names, "my friends". Drawn into the mutual and abiding love of the Father and Son, disciples are no longer called servants but friends. By his death Jesus 'befriends' the world. It is to such loyal befriending and fruit-bearing in steadfast love that Jesus commissions his disciples. *Fr Gerry*

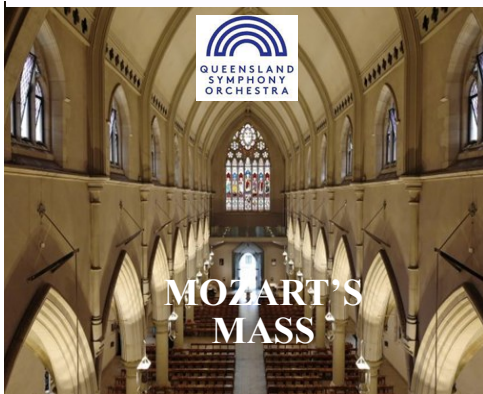

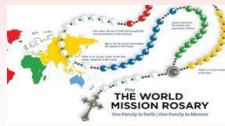
