The words of Jesus in this Sunday gospel are familiar to us. A version of those words has made their way into the text of our eucharist celebration, just before the sign of peace, 'Lord Jesus Christ who said to your Apostles: Peace I leave you, my peace I give you'. Jesus spoke those words to his disciples

whose hearts were troubled and afraid, and the prospect of Jesus' death at the hands of his enemies weighed heavily upon them. Yet, it is clear that Jesus himself is not troubled or afraid. Rather, he is at peace, and offers the gift of his peace to the disciples: 'Peace I bequeath to you, my own peace I give you, a peace the world cannot give, this is my gift to you'. Jesus' peace is rooted in his loving relationship with God his Father. He knows himself to be eternally loved by his heavenly Father. He also knows that beyond death he will be going to the Father whom he loves. He wants his disciples and all of us to experience something of his own peace. Jesus shows us that even when, from a human point of view, there is much to trouble us and make us afraid, we can still be at peace within ourselves because we know in the words of Saint Paul, *nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord*. Our sense of God's love for us, our love for God in return, gives us a share in the Lord's own peace, regardless of the situation in which we find ourselves. Sharing in that peace enables us to become channels of peace to one another.



Since then, the annual celebration has become a way for all Catholics to unite and rejoice in the progress we've made in bringing Laudato Si' to life and to commit ourselves to further prayer and action for our common home.

This year, with the theme of "Listening and Journeying Together" Catholics on six continents will work on "bringing the human family together to protect our common home" (LS 13), which is the guiding Laudato Si' quote for the weeklong celebration.

Catholics across the globe will unite their communities in action and learn more about how Laudato Si' offers a blueprint on how to tackle the climate crisis. Globally, Catholics will come together as one family in prayer and action.
