### **13<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time**

**What is our priority?** All the greats in this world are committed to whatever it is that makes them great. To be the best at something, that something must have priority in your life. 13<sup>th</sup> Sunday's Gospel passage teaches us that if we want to be a great Catholic or a wonderful human being, Jesus must have absolute priority in our lives. because he lived for the priority of his Father in Heaven- to save humankind.

Today's gospel tells us those who seek themselves are on the road to self-destruction. Our relationship with God, our loved ones, our community, and our world only find life through self-giving. Jesus of the gospels is clear. The way to life is through sacrifice, self-denial, and our daily cross. Our great and continuing temptation is to create a new Jesus in our own image that frees us from the harshness of this clear message.

We are the disciples of Jesus. Discipleship of Jesus enriches and expands our vision of the world. Our daily responsibilities of work, community and society open to new horizons when we walk with Jesus. We are invited beyond the surface, outside the narrow limits of our selfishness. We are called to enter the depths of life where we meet the wonder of God's love in the ordinary flow of life.

He says even a cup of water given to a disciple of Jesus will not go unrewarded. This passage should encourage us on two levels. First, we should be encouraged that God will reward those who support us in the proclamation of God's message. Secondly, we should be encouraged to know that God will use us in the encouragement of those who are proclaiming God's message. Every little prayer you pray, every little email or note of encouragement you write, every dollar you give is seen by God. As you do it for disciples of Jesus it is as if you are doing it for Jesus Himself. Jesus sees you and you will be rewarded. Pray with confidence and joy! Support with confidence and joy! Encourage with confidence and joy! Give with confidence and joy! *Fr Rony*

**Saints Peter and Paul, 29 June:** One a budding businessman. One a promising rabbinic scholar. Simon enjoyed fishing and the outdoors. Saul enjoyed the books and debate. Both were changed in their meeting with Jesus.

For Simon, the meeting was beside Lake Galilee. He left the family business and followed this itinerant preacher. In a revealing insight he named Jesus as the Christ and underwent his own name change. It became Peter, the rock on whom Jesus would build his church.

For Saul, the encounter was very different. It was on the road to Damascus, a bolt from the blue.

The persecutor was knocked over and lost his vision. Then came insight. The one he had been persecuting became his empowerment and his proclamation. The name change was not given by Jesus. His Semitic name, Saul, would have been odd and difficult for the wider public. His changed perspective set him to revert to Paul which would have been his common Roman name.



### **13<sup>th</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME – 28 JUNE 2020 (YEAR A)**

#### **Proper of the Mass**

**First Reading:** 2 Kings 4:8-11, 14-16 **Second Reading:** Romans 6:3-4, 8-11

**Response:** For ever I will sing the goodness of the Lord.

**Gospel Acclamation:** Alleluia, You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy people.  
Praise God who called you out of darkness and into his marvellous light. Alleluia!

**Gospel:** Matthew 10:37-42

The two eventually met in Jerusalem and swapped stories of their encounters with Jesus. The two went in different directions to share the Jesus story further. The next meeting was in Antioch where they disagreed about table fellowship. This led to the first church 'council' in Jerusalem. Again agreement on different missions to pursue.

Eventually, both Peter and Paul ended up in Rome. It was there that they met their death – Peter crucified in Nero's Circus on the Vatican hill, Paul beheaded on the road to Ostia. Diametrically different and one in conviction of Jesus as the Christ. It is His cross that we all take up and follow.

**Priests' Jubilee:** 29<sup>th</sup> June is the ordination anniversary of many of our Archdiocesan priests. In our diversity there is usually a common celebration on this day – except for 2020 which is different.

This year's Golden Jubilarians are Bishop Brian Finnigan, Fr John Garrahy, Msgr John Grace(Rockhampton) and Fr Brian Fitzpatrick OSA. The Silver Jubilarians are Fr Huong Van Nguyen and Fr Joseph-Hien Van Vo. The milestone of 60 years is also being marked for Fr Bill O'Shea, Fr Dan Carroll and Fr Peter Hayes OSA.

Due to COVID Restrictions the Jubilee Mass at the Cathedral at 10am on Monday June 29 will not be a Public event and has been restricted to 100 people. It will be livestreamed however at the following URL: [archbne.org/bzw](http://archbne.org/bzw).

### Parish Masses for up to 100:

Churches can have up to 100 people for Mass. It is the same for weddings, baptisms and funerals.

### Registration for SUNDAY mass attendance:

- Registration for Sunday mass will be via online [Eventbrite](https://www.eventbrite.com).
- Families can book up to 6 spaces at one time.
- Yes, you do have to book every week.
- Parishioners who do not have access to internet can phone the parish office.

Sunday mass will continue to be live streamed at 8.30am Sunday mornings.

Weekday mass schedule: **No online registration required**. See schedule in Parish Diary

### First Friday in July:

Mass will be back at Sacred Heart Rosalie at 9am.

There will NOT be anointing within mass. The most vulnerable are encouraged to stay at home.

Hand sanitizing and cleaning will be in place. Appropriate physical distancing. Registration of names will occur at the door.

There will be no morning tea or gathering afterwards.

Apart from that everything is getting back to normal. Further review for First Friday in August.

**Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick** will not be celebrated communally until further easing of protocols. That means that the Anointing mass at Newmarket for Wednesday 8 July will not be proceeding. If you perceive the need for the sacrament, **we will come to you**. Please contact one of the priests or the parish office and we will organize a time to come and celebrate with you.

**Liturgy Committee Meeting:** Because of the protocols of physical distancing and space requirements the parish will look to the first Saturday of August as our restart date. We await the continued easing of restrictions and increasing numbers. The original 10 July plan was that singing as well can proceed with the 4 square metre rules. Hopefully, we will all be singing the same tune!

Many thanks to the liturgy people in our communities as you promote good worship within the provided protocols.

### Sacramental Initiation for Year 3 and 4 this year and next:

For those in Year 4 upwards who are already preparing for First Holy Communion: continue preparation with your family at home, and when possible join in weekend mass.

When your passport is complete contact Jenny Donnelly and a date can be organized for your child to receive First Holy Communion at a weekend mass. Dates for larger celebrations will be provided when they can be celebrated in accordance with government protocols.

### Preparation for Confirmation for those presently in year 3:

Because of limits at weekend masses, AND uncertainty of unrestricted gatherings I am postponing preparation and celebration of Confirmation until early 2021.

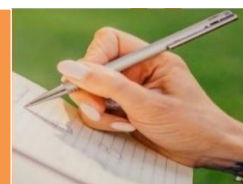


### Sacrament of Reconciliation
