
Prayers for Plenary Council Gathering # 2- July 3 – 9

The Second Assembly of the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia takes place from July 3-9. Masses and sessions will be live-streamed each day and people are invited to send messages of prayer, hope and support to the Members gathering in Sydney. The Framework for Motions "will form the backbone of our reflection, discussion and decision when we gather", Plenary Council president Archbishop Timothy Costelloe SDB wrote in a message to fellow Members.

The motions are contained within eight sections of the document:

1. Reconciliation: Healing Wounds, Receiving Gifts;
2. Choosing Repentance – Seeking Healing;
3. Called by Christ – Sent Forth as Missionary Disciples;
4. Witnessing to the Equal Dignity of Women and Men;
5. Communion in Grace: Sacrament to the World;
6. Formation and Leadership for Mission and Ministry;
7. At the Service of Communion, Participation and Mission: Governance;
8. Integral Ecology and Conversion for the Sake of Our Common Home.

My mission experience in the Catholic diocese of Vanimo:

Vanimo is a small town in the West Sepik Province of Papua New Guinea. I arrived there on the 23rd of April 2018 two days before the ordination of the current local ordinary Most Rev. Francis Meli who succeeded Most Rev. Cesare Bonivento PIME.

My journey was filled with mixed feelings of leaving family/friends for a strange far away land and the excitement of meeting new people with a different culture and traditions.

For the first few months in PNG, everything was so strange to me that most times I felt lost.

I experienced the cultural difference and language barrier. Although a good number of Papua New Guineans can speak English you can only relate and mingle better when you speak "Tok Pisin". Another big challenge for me was the food and adjusting to a different climate.

Gradually I began to settle down and within 8 months I was able to deliver my homilies in "Tok Pisin". I eventually got used to the environment and I began falling in love with the natural endowments in PNG: nice beaches, natural forests, clean rivers, high mountains etc. When thinking of traveling overseas for holiday/tour you can give PNG a try and I bet you will not regret it. 2021 Census. The Australian Bureau of Statistics yesterday released the first data from the 2021 Census. That included figures on religious affiliation, which show Catholics now make up 20 per cent of the population – down from 22.6 per cent in 2016. The combined Christian population is now 44 per cent. Those professing no religion comprise 39 per cent of those who answered the question on the Census.

Archbishop Coleridge said, "Almost half the population still identify as Christian, which means that Jesus is very much part of the mix

in the Australian soul We remain a large minority engaged far and wide in service of the community," including in education, social services, health and aged care – as well as parish life.

Blessed Peter To Rot was born on 5th of March 1912 in New Pomerania, Papua New Guinea. He served as a well-noted and beloved Catechist in his village and was entrusted to a local parish during World War II.

He stood up for religious values in the face of Japanese oppression and continued to hold secret communion service when the Japanese restricted him from active pastoral service. Peter To Rot had great value for marriage, he cared and loved his wife and children so well even in the midst of domestic violence and serial polygamy practiced by his kinsmen. He was an outspoken critic of Japanese lifestyle of taking multiple wives.

After series of warnings by the Japanese Peter To Rot never relented in doing his pastoral Activities. The Japanese poisoned him with a lethal injection and he died on the 7th July 1945 (aged 33). He was later beatified on 17th January 1995 by Pope John Paul II. Blessed Peter To Rot is a role model for married men, catechists and lay faithful in Papua New Guinea. **Fr. Fortune Okoro**
