Not alone

As humans, we have a natural desire to belong. We feel safer in the company of like-minded people and, in this weekend's readings, there is an overall theme of belonging and unity (as well as quite a few sheep!). We are part of God's flock; baptism was our initiation.



In the first reading, the Lord speaks through Jeremiah to condemn the early leaders who have allowed the flock to be scattered. God promises that the 'sheep' who are still faithful will be protected and rewarded with fresh and nourishing pastures, as so well described in the psalm. St Paul talks of peace and the unification of people with differing views into one people. And even though Mark's Gospel tells us that Jesus and the apostles are exhausted from their teaching and in need of rest, Jesus takes the time to talk to the gathered crowds as he is concerned that they are like sheep without a shepherd. While the image of shepherd and flock was resonant when these readings were written, most of us in Jubilee Parish live lives far removed from a rural setting. However, we still understand the need to come together in communion as one people through attendance at Mass, sharing the Eucharist and generally caring for each other. The Archdiocesan Synod, which moves into its next phase in September and October, is considering ways the church can respond to the needs of its people today to help mould an Archdiocese, parishes and local church communities where we all feel welcomed, nourished and connected. God has picked us to be part of his flock, despite how many times we wander off like lost lambs or get burs stuck in our wool. We pray that, through the process of listening and discernment, the upcoming Synod will provide some future direction and practical ways to nourish us and unite us in God's love. **Jennifer Cahill**

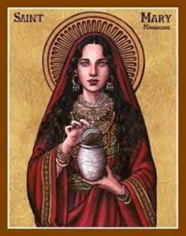
WELCOME to families with children preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation.

PROPERTY UPDATE: Centacare management have notified the Parish that they will not be renewing their lease at 187 Kennedy Tce, Paddington. A review of the Parish property assets confirms that the facility is surplus to Parish needs and, is not required by other Archdiocesan agencies. As a result, the Parish have made the decision to sell the property so that funds can be redistributed for alternate mission purposes. A five week marketing campaign for the sale of the property will be commencing on the 16th of July. The property will then be put to sale via a public auction on Thursday the 22nd of August. Further updates on the sale will be provided after the auction has taken place.

OLD ROSALIE CONVENT. In the ongoing saga of the MasterPlan redevelopment Application, there is a hearing this week, supposedly on Thursday. Hopefully this will be the final hearing about objections and development approval being given. This has been a painfully slow process. 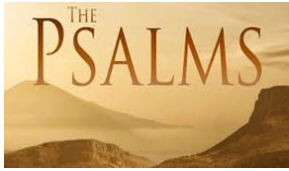

THE NUMBERING OF THE PSALMS : The psalm for 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time is listed as “Psalm 22 R. The Lord is my shepherd, there is nothing I shall want”. This is one of the best-known of all the psalms but most people know it as the 23rd Psalm and it is listed under Psalm 23 in many bibles.



Those who look up words for psalms for hymn sheets, etc will have noticed that the numbering of the psalms in the Catholic Lectionary and in Catholic missals is not always the same as used by other Churches. Why are these numbers sometimes different?

The problem comes about because, since the promulgation of the Latin Bible (Vulgate) in the 6th century, the Roman Catholic Church has followed the numbering of the psalms used by the Greek translation of the Scriptures (the Septuagint) whereas the scriptures used by other Christian traditions follow the numbering in the Hebrew text.

Psalms 9 and 10 in the Hebrew text were combined into one psalm in the Greek Bible, so from Psalm 9 onwards, the Roman Catholic psalm numbers are one less than those in other versions. Because Psalm 147 of the Jewish psalms is split into two separate psalms in the Septuagint, the total number of psalms in both finishes up being the same - 150. However, only the first 8 and the last 3 psalms agree in numbering.

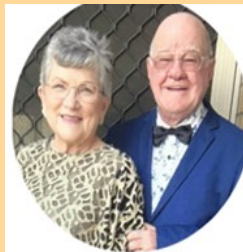

This week on Thursday, 18th July, year 3 students from St Finbarr's, St Joseph's and St. Ambrose's gathered at St. Joseph's School for an exciting day together at the Jubilee Parish, Year 3, Confirmation Retreat . The combined Parish retreat day was packed with fun and meaningful activities that supported our year 3 students in their preparation for the sacrament of Confirmation as well as giving them opportunity to mix with students from across our Parish.

The day began with some morning tea and play to get everyone energised and ready for the day ahead. After a warm welcome and gathering prayer students broke into groups for some engaging activities.

In their groups, students rotated through all of the following learning activities;

Quiz: To test their Holy Spirit and Confirmation knowledge with a True/False quiz.

Gifts: Exploring what the gifts of the Holy Spirit look like using scripture and real-life examples.

Confirmation Symbols: Learning about the symbolism of hands and oil and their link to confirmation.

Pentecost: Exploring into the Pentecost story from Acts.

Name: Discussing the meaning behind their baptismal names, why they were chosen, and who chose it.

In the afternoon students moved to St. Mary Magdalene church to view and discuss what students can expect to experience at the celebration of the Sacrament. To finish the day a Confirmation themed liturgy was celebrated. It was a great day of learning, celebration, formation and prayer.
