You are what you eat

It's been uplifting to hear good news stories coming out of the Olympic Games over the past couple of weeks. We usually consume news reports about bombings, riots, car-jackings etc. and, while these things are still being reported, positive news is much more nourishing.

There is also nourishment to be found in today's readings – literally and figuratively. In the first reading, Elijah is exhausted after narrowly escaping death at the hands of Queen Jezebel. He feels he has failed and has lost hope but is revived by the food and water left for him by an angel. It nourishes him and gives him the strength to continue his journey.

The gospel again refers to the manna from heaven given to the Israelites during their journey from Egypt, just as they too were at the point of giving up. Although that food sustained the people at the time, Jesus points out that they did eventually die, whereas the bread that Jesus offers, leads to eternal life. He repeats that he is the bread and the nourishment he provides is in his teachings.

These teachings include the qualities St Paul refers to in the second reading when he suggests that, as we are all loved children of God, we should treat each other with kindness, patience and forgiveness. It's a reminder to consume the bread of faith – in the word and the eucharist – to gain strength and nourishment for the journey. **Jennifer Cahill**

CLERGY CONVOCATION 2024. Over 150 Clergy from across the Archdiocese gathered at the Convention Centre last Thursday and Friday.



Archbishop Mark in beginning the gathering highlighted that it was not another business meeting, but one focused on our being Church in the Archdiocese.

Dr Trudy Dantis from the Australian Catholic Bishop's Conference National Centre for Pastoral Research took us through the social profile of the Archdiocese from the 2021 national Census. She also provided each parish with their profile. Jubilee Parish has 11,700 resident Catholics according to the 2021 Census. We have the social profile of each of the communities if you would like to discover more about the age breakdown, country of birth, recent arrivals (according to the 2021 census), occupational breakdown and more.

Dr Sally Towns, Executive Director of Brisbane Catholic Education provided information from a review of schools that was completed by Dr Lee-Ann Perry. This review provides the basis for future planning of Catholic Education in Brisbane in the next few years.

Steph Unger the Synod Executive Officer provided an update on the progress towards Synod 24.

Thursday there were deanery discussions as to the small steps that clergy could take up and put into practice from the information that was provided on Wednesday. Bishop Tim then pushed on in the afternoon reminding us of the growth that is expected in the region over the next 20 years. Coming from his mission experience as a member of the Divine Word Missionaries he wants to keep the clergy mindful and adept to the ever-growing migration into southeast Queensland. It is not simply being mindful, it is how do we take it up as missionary disciples.

The clergy prayed together and had a celebratory meal to acknowledge the Jubilarians that were noted in last weekend's newsletter. The gathering with the clergy is one of the true benefits of the convocation.

VOCATIONS AWARENESS WEEK 4-11 August: We believe that God has a plan for



our lives. He calls some to marriage, some to the priesthood, and others to a consecrated life or to live as generous single people.

National Vocations Awareness Week is an annual week-long celebration dedicated to promoting vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life through prayer and education, and to renewing our prayers and support for those who are considering one of these vocations. 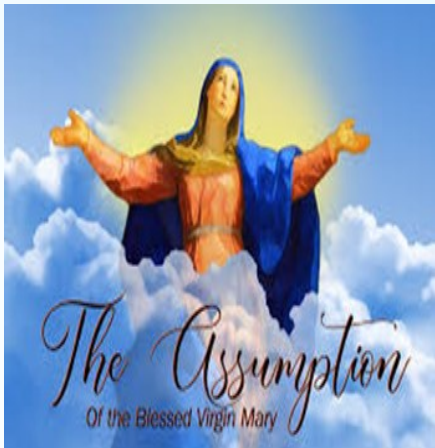

PROPERTY NEWS: 187 KENNEDY TCE PADDINGTON: Centacare have left this site. A review of the Parish property assets confirmed that the facility is surplus to Parish needs. It is also not required by other Archdiocesan agencies.

RESPECT AT WORK LEGISLATION: Dear Parishioners, Here is an update on the "Respect at Work" legislation that is before the Queensland Parliament. This legislation was originally the Anti-Discrimination legislation but after the Archdiocese, in partnership with Queensland Churches Together, submission and campaign activity they withdrew that legislation because they received hundreds of letters from parishioners.

The Parliamentary committee examining the legislation has now released its report, which completely ignored the detailed submission from the combined faith leaders. At the same time, the Attorney General has said she is too busy to meet with faith leaders to discuss our concerns.

Now the Archdiocese, with Queensland Churches Together, is working with denominational leaders on a few responses to help convince the Government and Opposition to protect our religious freedoms:

One of the most effective ways to influence MPs is to write to them. When dozens, or hundreds, write short polite letters about an issue, they take notice.
