## The First shall be Last

In today's gospel, Jesus gives the Pharisees a very practical lesson in good manners! In summary, as my mother would have said; "It's polite to wait 'till you're asked". Clearly, good manners were just as important to the smooth running of society 2000 years ago as they are today. By being polite, putting others before yourself, you do not run the

risk of the social embarrassment of looking like a self-important buffoon.

When you scratch the surface and consider the context of this lesson, there is much more than Jesus giving the Pharisees a little bit of advice on courtesy. Pharisees were considered, or at least considered themselves to be, the highest echelon of Jewish society. They were ostentatious in their dress and conspicuous in their strict observance of Jewish religion and law. Appearances were everything to them. They were notoriously self-righteous and the thought of putting others before themselves probably never occurred to them.

Jesus was invited to lunch with the Pharisees, not because they liked him but because they wanted to observe him and where possible prove him wrong. Jesus, aware that he was entering a hostile social situation, with razor sharp precision, went straight to the very core of the problem. He let the Pharisees know that their position of self-importance did not serve them well and put them at risk of being publicly embarrassed. They probably did not like this lesson coming from the lowly carpenter, but they could not have faulted his logic.

This paved the way for Jesus to tell them the more important message well above social niceties and courtesy, that they needed to hear. That is, seek your reward in heaven. Do not look for earthly acclamation or reward. The real reward lies in heaven. The reward in heaven is found by humbling yourself to the way of God and loving your neighbour as yourself. **The Last Shall be First.**
