

24th Sunday in Ordinary Time



Take up Your Cross and Follow Me: In the Gospel this weekend Mark tells us about an episode on the way to Caesarea. There is a lot going on in this Gospel. Jesus and his disciples are a long way from home heading to a region where he is unlikely to be well known. I supposed Jesus is thinking about what he will find, how he will be accepted when he gets there. He is after all, human and like any of us going to an unknown place he wonders what it will be like, what the people will think of him.

He asks the disciples who the people might think he is, and the disciples guess people might think he is John the Baptist or the prophet Elijah. Then Jesus asks his disciples who they think he is and Peter correctly identifies Jesus as the Christ, that is our Savior. In response to this correct answer, Jesus goes on to explain what it means to be the Christ: That he will die a humiliating and cruel death of a criminal in order that he can rise again and deliver us from our sins. But Peter will not have this – that his leader and Lord will die a cruel and humiliating death on a cross. Surely, a man such as Jesus is important, powerful and will be accepted and respected by all, not crucified? His fame and good works will see him right.

But Jesus rebukes Peter for this in the strongest possible terms, "Get behind me Satan!"

What was Jesus telling Peter and us. I think the message here is that to know Jesus is easy, he is available to us and wants to be known, but to follow him is much more difficult. If we are to be true follows of Christ, true disciples, it is not enough to simply know him. To follow him means to take up his cross to be prepared to renounce the trapping of our lives even to the point of death. This is a tough message, a significant challenge. Most of us won't meet this challenge as wholly as Jesus Christ did. We are unlikely to be asked to die for our discipleship or our faith, but it is a standard to aim for and to think about how we carry the Cross of Christ in our daily lives. *Gina Clare*

Exaltation of the Cross: On September 14th the Church celebrates the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. This commemorates two historical events: the discovery in 320 of the True Cross by Saint Helena, (mother of Emperor Constantine) under the temple of Venus in Jerusalem; and the dedication in 335 of the basilica and shrine built on Calvary by Constantine, which marks the site of the Crucifixion. The Persians destroyed the basilica and shrine in 614. In 1149 on that site, the Crusaders built the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. However, the feast, more than anything else, is a celebration and commemoration of God's greatest work: his death on the Cross and His Resurrection. The entrance antiphon for the feast is *"We should glory in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, for he is our salvation, our life and our resurrection: through him we are saved and made free."* Fr Rony

Reflection 2 - our land & soils



Last Friday was a Pupil Free Day, so the staff came together for a formation day. The theme of the day was on **Sacramentality, seeing God in all things**. When we take on such a view and begin to **see God in everything and everyone**, we begin to understand these things are a gift from God, we also begin to realise that God's presence and grace **can be witnessed in the ordinary of everyday life**. So, when we stop to watch the sun set, or a petal fall, or a child smile or a dog run, we are witnessing God and his many gifts.

St Ignatius Loyola believed that by reflecting on our day and giving thanks for what we have received, our relationship with God and those around us is improved. St Ignatius developed a prayer called The Examen. In this prayer we take time to reflect on what has transpired during the day and what we could do to improve our day to be one with God. Through the Examen we come to know God's love for us more deeply, gradually becoming more aware of God's presence in everything. The Examen provides a mirror which reflects God's active presence in our everyday lives. Below is a simple outline to follow if you wish to give it ago.

How to pray the Examen

- 1. Become aware of God's presence.**
- 2. Review the day with gratitude.**
- 3. Pay attention to your emotions.**
- 4. Choose one feature of the day and pray from it.**
- 5. Look toward tomorrow.**
