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## 26<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time



The Gospel of today begins with the issue of how authority is mediated in the Christian community. Mark presents the incident of an exorcist. The disciples observed that the unknown exorcist invoked Jesus' name and was successful in his healing efforts. This unknown healer recognized the power of Jesus' name, yet he was not a follower of Jesus

The Apostles did not approve of this man and John tells Jesus how they tried to stop him and point out to him that

they alone are the chosen ones and not he. In his reply to his disciples, Jesus acknowledges that deeds of faith can precede the words of faith. He also teaches that the disciples should not be reluctant to share Jesus' healing powers with others.

Later in the Gospel Jesus teaches us not to create obstacles for those who are just beginning to have faith but to encourage even the smallest signs of faith. In vivid terms he also teaches his disciples the consequences to those who would put obstacles before people who are on the road to faith.

Jesus makes use of this opportunity to enunciate an important principle of discipleship: "Whoever is not against us is for us." Do we stop others if they do not belong to us?

**World Day of Migrants and Refugees - 2021:** For the 107<sup>th</sup> WORLD DAY OF MIGRANTS AND REFUGEES, to be celebrated on 26<sup>th</sup> September, Pope Francis has chosen the theme TOWARDS AN EVER WIDER "WE". His Holiness explains... - "God created humankind in his image, (Gen 1:27) ..... God created us in the image of his own triune being, a communion in diversity. When, in disobedience we turned away from God, he in his mercy wished to offer us a path of reconciliation, not as individuals but as a people, a "we", meant to embrace the entire human family, without exception: The present time, however, shows that this "we" willed by God is broken and fragmented, wounded and disfigured. This becomes all the more evident in moments of great crisis, as is the case with the current pandemic. Our "we", both in the wider world and within the Church, is crumbling and cracking due to myopic and aggressive forms of nationalism (cf. Fratelli Tutti, 11) and radical individualism (cf. ibid., 105). And the highest price is being paid by those who most easily become viewed as others: foreigners, migrants, the marginalized, those living on the existential peripheries. The truth however is that we are all in the same boat and called to work together so that there will be no more walls that separate us, no longer others, but only a single "we", encompassing all of humanity. Thus, I would like to use this World Day to address a twofold appeal, first to the Catholic faithful and then all the men and women of our world, to advance together towards an ever wider "we".

## FROM POPE FRANCIS: LAUDATO SI (PRAISE BE!)

In the Christian understanding of the world, the destiny of all creation is bound up with the mystery of Christ, present from the beginning: "All things have been created through him and for him" (Colossians 1:16) Paragraph 99.

The prologue of the Gospel of John (1:1-18) reveals Christ's creative work as the Divine Word (Logos). ...this same Word became flesh, One Person of the Trinity entered into the created cosmos, throwing in his lot with


it, even to the cross (Paragraph 100).

For us today to consider and pray:

Not only did Jesus Christ have a loving and relationship with the world but risen in glory He is present throughout creation. Can I gaze on the Lord of all creation knowing that? Do I really believe that He will deliver all things to God the Father, so that God may be everything to every one?

Pope Francis concludes: The very flowers of the field and the birds which his human eyes contemplated and admired are now imbued with his radiant presence (Paragraph 100).

**Saint Vincent de Paul** was a French Catholic priest who dedicated himself to serving the poor. He was a pioneer in clerical training and was instrumental in establishing seminaries, and founder of the Congregation of the Mission (CM). He has a charity named after him by Blessed Frédéric Ozanam - Society of St Vincent de Paul (SVP or SvDP). He was renowned for his compassion, humility, and generosity. Vincent was canonized in 1737 and is venerated in the Catholic Church and the Anglican Communion. We acknowledge and appreciate the wholehearted charitable works of all the St Vincent De Paul Society communities of Jubilee Parish. Let your charity and compassion provide life to the poor in our society.



**Saints Michael, Gabriel and Raphael:** The Feast Day of these 3 Archangels is celebrated on 29<sup>th</sup> September. Michael (Who is like God) fought against Satan and is known as the protector of all humanity from the snares of the devil. Gabriel (Strength of God) announced to Zachariah the forthcoming birth of John the Baptist, and to Mary, the birth of Jesus. His greeting to Mary, "Hail, full of grace," is one of the most familiar and frequent of prayers. Raphael (Medicine of God) is the archangel who took care of Tobias on his journey. Let these three awaken in us the image of God within us, strengthen us in our difficulties, and shield us from all evils.
