**“And the two shall become one flesh, so they are no longer two but one flesh. What therefore God has joined together, let no man separate”**

In every sacrament by ritual, we express the unseen presence of God who gifts us with love. In the sacrament of marriage God's love becomes present to the couple in their total commitment and union to one another, but going beyond just the two of them and out to their family and community.

The breaking of these commitments can cause problems in family life. Love binds the family together and when love is lost then families can face problems. God is the source of love and our commitment to God energizes our family with great love. Our connection with God can strengthen our relationship to be stronger and more loving in family relationships.

The second reading reveals the humility and exaltation of Jesus. He, the divine son, took on human flesh, becoming lower than the angels. But this humility led to his exaltation, crowning him with glory and honour. Why did Jesus do this? He did it so that by the grace of God, he might taste death for everyone. He took upon himself the consequences of our sin, freeing us from its grip.

And here is the amazing part: because of Jesus' incarnation and death, we are now part of God's family. We are his brothers and sisters. It means that we have hope. We have a future; we have a divine family. *Fr Tomi*

**Synod 2024:** Pope Francis opened the second session of the Synod of Bishops defending his decision to give women and laymen votes at the assembly, saying it reflects the Second Vatican Council's teaching that a bishop exercises his ministry with and within the people of God. A total of 57 women were named members of the synod's 2024 session.



"It is certainly not a matter of replacing one with the other, rallying to the cry: 'Now it is our turn!'" the pope said as the 368 synod members – including what the Vatican described as 96 "non-bishops" – began their work Oct. 2 in the Paul VI Audience Hall.

The pope told members at the assembly "We are being asked to work together symphonically, in a composition that unites all of us in the service of God's mercy, in accordance with the different ministries and charisms that the bishop is charged to acknowledge and promote".

## The Scripture Readings at Sunday Mass

The first document issued by the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965), the *Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy*, emphasised that “Sacred Scripture is of the greatest importance in the celebration of the liturgy”. In response, the Lectionary (the book containing the extracts from the Bible read at public worship) published soon after Vatican II provided a much greater range of readings from scripture than had been the case previously.

The Gospel readings for Sunday Masses were decided upon first. They are consecutive passages taken from the gospel allocated to each year in a three-year cycle called A, B and C. The Gospel of Matthew is read in Year A, Mark in Year B and Luke in Year C. The Gospel of John does not have its own year but is read every year on some Sundays of Lent, on Holy Thursday and Good Friday and during Easter.

The first reading for each Sunday of the three-year cycle was then selected. It is almost always taken from the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament) and is chosen because it harmonises with the Gospel. In the Easter Season the first reading is from the Book of Acts which records the progress of the early Church, its witness and its growth.


The second reading comes from one of the New Testament letters (epistles), most often from Paul but also from Peter, John and James. It normally has no thematic relationship to either the first reading or the Gospel. The same epistle is read in a semi-continuous way over a number of Sundays. *Elizabeth Harrington*
