Prayerful faithfulness: Jesus parable goal: the need to pray continually and never lose heart.

FEAST OF ST TERESA OF AVILA — 15 OCTOBER



On Saturday the 15th of October we celebrate the feast of St Teresa of Avila.

St Teresa was born into Spanish nobility in 1515. This was a tumultuous time for the catholic church with the Protestant reformation sweeping over Europe and the Spanish Inquisition asserting church discipline in her home country. As a prominent woman of her time, Teresa had an extremely interesting life and it is well worth the trouble to find out more about her if you are so inclined. In summary....

In 1533, she joined the Carmelite Convent of the Incarnation and took up religious reading on contemplative prayer. As a Carmelite nun, she went on to become a prominent Spanish mystic, religious reformer and theologian. Embracing a life of spirituality and mysticism, she became a prolific writer and significantly, she reformed the Carmelite order, restoring it to a life of austerity and mental prayer.

Teresa died in October 1582, aged 67. Forty years after her death, in 1622, Teresa was canonized by Pope Gregory XV. On 27th September 1970, Pope Paul VI proclaimed Teresa the first female Doctor of the Church in recognition of her centuries-long spiritual legacy to Catholicism. *Gina Clare*


Many families in Emdibir are subsistence farmers, and distressingly, many are unable to put enough food on the table each day.

At St Joseph's Bardon, the Franciscan values of Humility, Care and Respect permeate the community. The Franciscan Sisters were the foundation order who began St Joseph's in 1938. Central to our school logo is the Tau Cross. Did you know that the Tau cross is the way St Francis signed his name, as did many poor uneducated people in his time. St Francis was educated but signed this way in solidarity with the poor. Throughout the day, our buddy classes came together to dialogue about St Francis, and they completed some activities together to mark this special day in the school calendar.
