This weekend's readings start with a bang with the proclamation, *The Lord has been pleased to crush his servant with suffering*. This seemingly harsh statement from the *Song of the Suffering Servant*, establishes the theme of service. The servant of the title endures many trials and hardships, but is ultimately rewarded with contentment and light.

The Gospel reading continues this theme. To put it into context, in the previous 2-3 verses, Jesus tells the disciples about his upcoming death and resurrection. He says that the legal hierarchy – the chief priests and scribes – will not just condemn him to death, but will allow him to be taunted, spat on and tortured before being cruelly killed, before rising again on the third day.

This seems like strange timing for James and John to ask to be made his first and second lieutenants and for the other disciples to reveal they have similar ambitions. Jesus patiently explains that, as a Christian community, they (we) operate differently from the way the greater society works. The path to glory is not based on where we sit in the hierarchy, it's based on our service to others. Jesus also dispels the concept of 'paying it forward', not wanting us to think we'll earn a gold pass to paradise by taking on more suffering today. God doesn't want us to suffer, but to put ourselves at the service of others without any feelings of resentfulness or pride. God wants us to serve others out of love, just as Jesus sacrificed himself for love of us. **Jennifer Cahill**

Archbishop's Appointment: Archbishop Mark has appointed Fr Tony Girvan to Sacramental Ministry to St Michael's Parish Dorrington. This is in addition to his continuing role as Chaplain to Prisons in the Archdiocese.

The Archbishop thanked Fr Tony for his role as Sacramental Minister at Jubilee Parish in recent years. It means he will work with Deacon Peter Devenish-Meares who is the Pastoral Director of St Michael's Dorrington.

The appointment is to be effective from early in the new year.

This will necessitate changes in both Jubilee and Dorrington. These changes will be worked through in discussion between both parishes, involving parishioners and clergy. Change is never easy. The good thing is that we have some time to work through to what will be the future mass schedules of both parishes. I know this will be unsettling for people as some routines will have to change. The regular celebration of eucharist will continue to be celebrated in both parishes though in a slightly different timetable. It is also what is sustainable with the reduced number of clergy. We continue to pray for our parishes and for the living out of all our vocations.

The program is designed to enhance my understanding of administration, liturgical and sacramental aspects of Parish ministry with a particular focus on my role and responsibilities as a parish priest. More on Receiving Communion : Occasionally a communicant takes the host they have received and dips it into the consecrated wine before consuming it. This action is called intinction. The *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* explains clearly that the only way intinction may happen is for the priest to take the host, dip it into the consecrated wine, and place it on the communicant’s tongue. This complex procedure is simply too impractical to carry out at parish Masses.

We receive Communion; we do not take it. For this reason, it is as inappropriate to dip the host into the chalice and take the Precious Blood as it would be to take a host from the plate. Also, germs are spread when hosts that have been handled are dipped into the cup from which others will drink.

Some people genuflect just before receiving Communion. Apart from being hazardous to others in the line, such a gesture goes against the Church’s encouragement of uniformity of posture as a sign of our unity. The *General Instruction* directs the faithful to “bow in reverence of the Mystery that we are to receive” when approaching to receive Holy Communion.

For some reason, it has become quite common to see communicants make the sign of the cross immediately after receiving Communion. Sometimes communion plates and chalices are knocked by people making this gesture. In that moment the focus is on the actions of eating and drinking and praying in thanksgiving for having received the Body and Blood of Christ. **Elizabeth Harrington**
