I don't know whether you have ever noticed this


Before but, one of the interesting features in Jesus' teachings is that He often uses two clearly opposed positions or circumstances as illustrations to teach his disciples some important truth. For instance, the two men who built their house on different foundations, the two sisters Martha and Mary, the rich man and Lazarus, two criminals at the crucifixion and in this Sunday's gospel the story of the Pharisee and the tax-collector.

The Pharisees were Jews who very devout and God's fearing people. They were essentially good people, but in their eagerness to do things right, they appear to consider themselves better than others. Tax collectors, on the other hand, were generally regarded as dishonest people. They represented the foreign power of Rome to tax their own people. They often charged more than was required to keep the extra for themselves. So among the Jews at that time, tax collectors were considered as traitors and corrupt.

In the parable Jesus told, both of them go up to pray in the temple. The Pharisee prayed a prayer of thanksgiving and the tax collector a prayer of petition. Both forms of prayer are valid; it is good to both ask God for what we need and to thank God for all he has given. Yet, what completely undermined the value of the Pharisee's prayer was his lack of love for a fellow worshipper. The Pharisee looked down on the tax collector as a sinner. The Pharisee presumed that his own relationship with God was of a much higher order than the tax collector's relationship with God. He seems to have had no awareness that his judgemental attitude towards a fellow worshipper significantly damaged his relationship with God. The tax collector, in contrast, did not judge the Pharisee. He only judged himself, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner'. The humble recognition that his relationship with God was not all it could be, created the opening for God to restore that relationship.

The one who prayed as if he were closer to God than others went home at odds with God. The one who prayed out of his awareness that he was at odds with God went home reconciled to God. **Fr Dang**


