Greetings from Vietnam,

Today is the last Sunday in the Church's liturgical year, the Feast of Christ the King. Interestingly, the Church has chosen a rather strange gospel passage to celebrate the kingship of Christ. It is the scene of Jesus facing death by crucifixion. As Christians, if we want to look upon the one who is lord of all creation, we are to look at Jesus hanging on the cross.

The real message of our crucified saviour reigning as a king in our lives is not that Jesus, having suffered for us, will somehow keep us away from suffering. Rather, Jesus faces the toughest situations and even a horrible death in order to make it clear that no tough times or suffering can ultimately triumph over God's power to save us and give us new life.

God's power and presence in our lives doesn't stop the suffering and problems we face. But God's presence and promise gives us hope and strength to deal with the tough times, just as the vision and promise of God gave ancient people strength to endure, and just as God's promise and presence gave Jesus the strength to face death. As we celebrate the solemnity of Christ the King, it reminds us of two important things. Firstly, we need to hold on to the vision of God's promises instead of being consumed by the problems in our lives.

Secondly, we need to courageously act on our faith. The best way to live into God's reign is to make God's reign present in the world by showing Jesus' love to others and by confessing with our words and deeds that God's reality matters.

Today, we remember that God's kingdom is a present reality, even in the midst of sufferings that we might face. Jesus constantly calls us to live in the light of God's reign by staying connected to God and to one another in our everyday lives. *Fr Dang*


## BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE: 'Christ has been raised from the dead, the first-fruits

# PROPERTY NEWS

**PARISH PROPERTY NOTES:** Lavalla Roof replacement has had to be postponed. A company to do the asbestos removal was not available. Whole project has to be re-scoped and various contractors aligned to reroof sometime in 2023. Expensive!

**Good news.** EarlyEd Care reroofing moved forward as roofing company moved from Lavalla. Job being completed at present.

**MasterPlan.** Good news on application for Kennedy Terrace and Caxton Street may come through soon. Bad news the Rosalie application will be asked for further information. Up until the last days of public query, there were few objections. A flurry of activity by some in the last couple of days saw letters to Council. Most of these "objections" had actually been covered in parish submission if they had taken time to look at it. Parish has to again wait on slow moving Council.

**POPE FRANCIS:** "We can pray for Ukraine by saying, 'Hurry up, Lord,'" Pope Francis told pilgrims at his weekly general audience. This week St Finbarr's are acknowledging **Wellbeing Week**.
