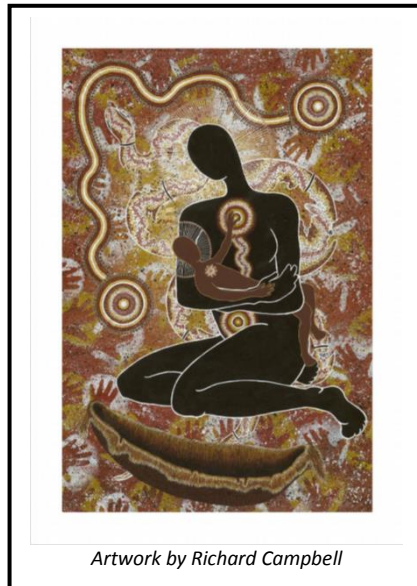

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time – 30 June / 1 July, 2018

Back to one of Mark's 'sandwich gospel' stories where he inserts a story within a story. Possibly this reflects the reality of our lives with incident within incident, within incident. Life can be like that at times. Part of life's messiness is its roll and tumble of sickness and death. This week's gospel has various ways in which people can respond to these realities, as well as God's invitations. We might want to deny, discount and even try to avoid it. Jesus inspires us to engage, speak up, have faith and this faith will bring peace and cause us to 'rise up' even when disease would seem to be taking life from us. Plenty for us to feed on!

Because of her, we can: The role of women in families and communities and in the Catholic Church is the focus of this year's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday, to be celebrated on July 1. The theme for this year's celebration "Because of her, we can" – is shared with the theme for NAIDOC week, to be held from July 8-15. In its annual message, the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference praised the role of women, especially mothers and grandmothers, in the life of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities. It also speaks of the role model of the Virgin Mary in the life of the Catholic Church. In the face of injustice in various ways, Indigenous women have "battled, and largely succeeded, in holding Indigenous families together" *Australian Catholic Bishops*.

In a video <https://www.catholicweekly.com.au/bishops-focus-on-mothers-this-aboriginal-and-torres-strait-islander-sunday/> that shares the bishops' message and images of Indigenous life and worship, Bishop Christopher Saunders of Broome explains that the experiences of many Indigenous women are captured in the iconic Marian image of the Pieta – depicting Mary holding the broken body of Jesus. "The Pieta is a prayerful image of motherhood to be nurtured, supported and prayed for in our community. The loving care that this masterpiece portrays cannot be separated from the sorrow of the reality it represents. And yet mothers, like Mary, the Mother of the Church, in their maternal mission assist others to rise above the tragedies and tribulations of life in the knowledge that greater moments await us when in hope and in faith we are brought out of darkness into His own wonderful light."

Five years ago, I underwent a thirty day silent retreat to prepare for priesthood. It was an Ignatian retreat that really goes deep. No stone is left unturned in terms of looking at who you are and how we are called to prayer.

One of the 'graces' of the thirty day silent retreat is since you cannot talk, all your other senses come into play.

In the world at the moment, we are so crowded with words and talking. Spend five minutes just listening down the street or in the classroom, or at the shops and you will hear it. It's just so noisy.

Tuning into our other senses slows us down and makes us realise that the continual bombardment of words contributes to a negative mindset and a negative view of the world.

When was the last time you really smelt your food, or admired the way someone's face looks? When was the last time you just held someone's hand or listened to the rolling of the waves at the beach?

God is waiting for us to use our senses, to tune into Creation.

Wake up and look, feel, smell, taste and listen. God is waiting for you in these senses.

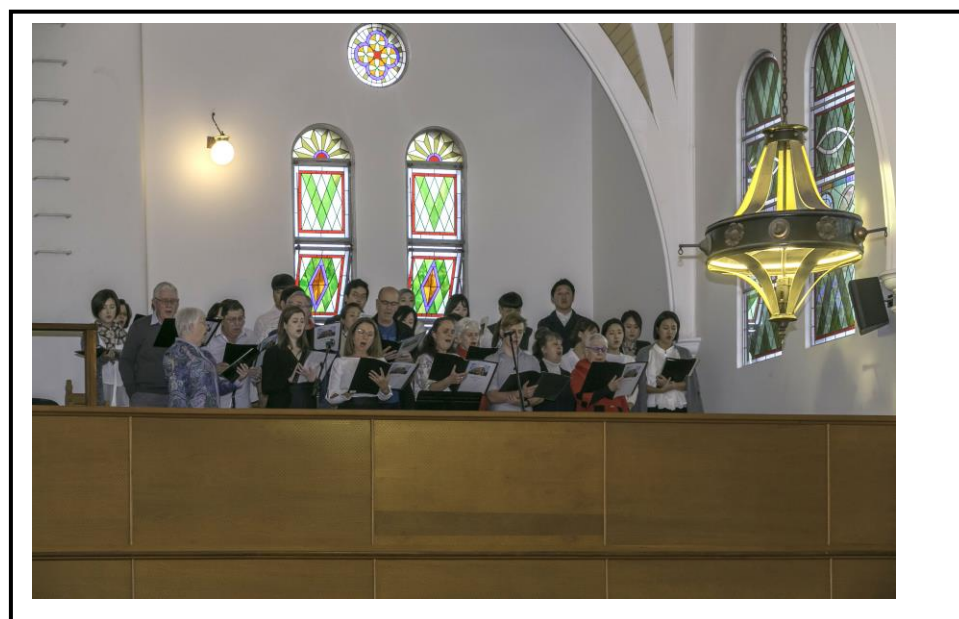
Position Vacant – Parish Secretary (Full-Time)
