Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time – 14 / 15 July 2018

This goes with that! Jesus has not been deterred by his rejection at Nazareth as he goes to teach among the surrounding villages. It is decisive in that Jesus now decides it is time to share the mission with the Twelve. Equipped with the authority of Jesus' word and his example, they are sent out like their ancestors with exodus urgency. They are sent with their walking staffs and sandals for they are on a new and urgent journey to free enslaved bodies, hearts and minds as Jesus has done. They are to travel in pairs, with respect for the Jewish tradition that required that the validity of witness must be verified by at least two people (Deut. 17:6, 19:15). There is to be no dilly-dallying with extra encumbrances. The mission is to proclaim the Word. The providence of God will provide, as there will be hospitality of homes and hearts as they go. Next weekend's gospel will tell us how they went. During the week we are also to be alert to how Jesus' invitation to evangelisation is having an effect in our lives.

Welcome Deacon Brendan Gormley: The Archbishop has appointed Deacon Brendan to Jubilee Parish until the end of 2018. We warmly welcome him to our local fold and look forward to getting to know him and experience his ministry. You are part of his ongoing formation as he gets into pastoral ministry and involved with what Pope Francis has named "the smell of the sheep!" Deacon Brendan is the same as Deacon Peter, as well as different. Both are ordained ministers of the Church to proclaim the Word, celebrate the sacraments of baptism and marriage, and serve the world. The difference is Brendan is being formed for the priesthood. Peter is living his vocation of marriage with his wonderful wife Jo and children Georgina, Charlotte and Emily. If you are confused, greater clarity will come over the next six months.

Greetings: *"Dear parishioners, my name is Brendan Gormley and last year I was ordained a Deacon for the Archdiocese of Brisbane. I am originally from Townsville and spent much of my working career in banking and finance and later in pastoral care. During the past four years I have been studying at the Pontifical Beda College in Rome, which is a seminary that caters specifically for men aged over thirty from English-speaking countries preparing for ministerial priesthood. I have now finished my time in Rome and am continuing my pastoral formation here at Jubilee parish. I am grateful for the opportunity I had to live and study in the heart of the Church and to enjoy so much of what Italy has to offer, much of which I'll miss. However, having seen enough soccer, pasta and train strikes there to last me a lifetime I am happy to be back on home soil and am enjoying the more familiar surroundings and some of life's simple pleasures such as watching a bit of rugby league. I would like to thank Fathers Gerry and Marty and the entire parish for allowing me to be with you during this time and I look forward to being on this journey of faith with you. Please pray for me as I will for you all. May God bless you, Deacon Brendan".*

Sacraments of Confirmation and First Communion 2018 -2019: Parishioners will be aware that this year Jubilee Parish is aligning itself with the Archdiocesan Sacramental Policy. This has been rolled out across the Brisbane Archdiocese over the last few years, and this was the transition year for Jubilee Parish.

Confirmation: Children prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation from the year they turn eight (Year Three). Enrolment form is available on the parish website.

The parent information night is Thursday night 19 July 2018, 7pm Sacred Heart Church Rosalie. **THIS IS COMPULSORY FOR ONE OF THE PARENTS.**

Enrolments close Friday 20 July. Families will have six weeks to work with their children on their workbooks and join in the weekly celebration of mass in the parish.

The sacrament of Confirmation will be celebrated 30 -31 August 2018.

First Communion: From the year when the children turn nine (year Four), they are welcomed to the Lord's Table and receive Holy Communion for the first time. This is the climax of their Christian Initiation. The preparation for this, including participation at Sunday mass will be explained at the parent night 19 July 2018.

Safeguarding News

1) Pope's message lays foundation for new safeguarding strategy 2018 – 2020

Pope Francis's call for "zero tolerance" towards sexual abuse has underpinned a new safeguarding strategy across the Archdiocese of Brisbane. Archbishop Mark Coleridge said Pope Francis's words were an important factor in the Archdiocese's design of a strategy that will apply to all ministries and services for the next three years. This strategy focuses upon the 3P's of Safeguarding: Safe People, Safe Practices & Safe Places, along with the foundation principle that 'safeguarding is everyone's responsibility'. The Archdiocese's new strategy applies to all church personnel including bishops, clergy, religious, employees, contractors and volunteers across all parishes, ministries, agencies and services. The Archdiocese encourages Church workers and the community to raise concerns about abuse or other safeguarding issues within the Church. Concerns can be raised with the Office for Safeguarding Services or via the independent and confidential STOPLine service.

2) Change in Safeguarding training requirements for volunteers

In light of the Royal Commission recommendations and national draft standards by the new national body, Catholic Professional Standards Ltd, the Safeguarding Office have thoroughly overhauled the safeguarding training content to meet new requirements. The current training provided face-to-face is specifically targeted for those in more leadership positions, or who are engaged with children & vulnerable adults. The Safeguarding Office has been working with Catholic Church Insurance & Catholic Professional Standards Ltd in creating online based training that would be more concise and convenient for volunteers. This online training may become available by the end of the year.

Volunteers who are not due for Safeguarding training, or who are listed as *minimal – moderate* on People & Culture (HR) Team's *Volunteer Requirement Matrix* (which includes Communion Ministers and Readers) or who are not engaged with any children & vulnerable adults, may postpone their training until online options become available at the end of 2018.

Our Local Safeguarding Representative Ray Orr will be providing further updates in future Newsletters.

YOUR MISSION IN CHRIST

(excerpt from the Apostolic Exhortation *Gaudete Et Exsultate* - Pope Francis)

19. A Christian cannot think of his or her mission on earth without seeing it as a path of holiness, for “this is the will of God, your sanctification” (1 Thess 4:3). Each saint is a mission, planned by the Father to reflect and embody, at a specific moment in history, a certain aspect of the Gospel.

20. That mission has its fullest meaning in Christ, and can only be understood through him. At its core, holiness is experiencing, in union with Christ, the mysteries of his life. It consists in uniting ourselves to the Lord’s death and resurrection in a unique and personal way, constantly dying and rising anew with him. But it can also entail reproducing in our own lives various aspects of Jesus’ earthly life: his hidden life, his life in community, his closeness to the outcast, his poverty and other ways in which he showed his self-sacrificing love. The contemplation of these mysteries, as Saint Ignatius of Loyola pointed out, leads us to incarnate them in our choices and attitudes.[18] Because “everything in Jesus’ life was a sign of his mystery”,[19] “Christ’s whole life is a revelation of the Father”,[20] “Christ’s whole life is a mystery of redemption”,[21] “Christ’s whole life is a mystery of recapitulation”.[22] “Christ enables us to live in him all that he himself lived, and he lives it in us”.[23]

21. The Father’s plan is Christ, and ourselves in him. In the end, it is Christ who loves in us, for “holiness is nothing other than charity lived to the full”.[24] As a result, “the measure of our holiness stems from the stature that Christ achieves in us, to the extent that, by the power of the Holy Spirit, we model our whole life on his”.[25] Every saint is a message which the Holy Spirit takes from the riches of Jesus Christ and gives to his people.

22. To recognize the word that the Lord wishes to speak to us through one of his saints, we do not need to get caught up in details, for there we might also encounter mistakes and failures. Not everything a saint says is completely faithful to the Gospel; not everything he or she does is authentic or perfect. What we need to contemplate is the totality of their life, their entire journey of growth in holiness, the reflection of Jesus Christ that emerges when we grasp their overall meaning as a person.[26]

23. This is a powerful summons to all of us. You too need to see the entirety of your life as a mission. Try to do so by listening to God in prayer and recognizing the signs that he gives you. Always ask the Spirit what Jesus expects from you at every moment of your life and in every decision you must make, so as to discern its place in the mission you have received. Allow the Spirit to forge in you the personal mystery that can reflect Jesus Christ in today’s world.

24. May you come to realize what that word is, the message of Jesus that God wants to speak to the world by your life. Let yourself be transformed. Let yourself be renewed by the Spirit, so that this can happen, lest you fail in your precious mission. The Lord will bring it to fulfilment despite your mistakes and missteps, provided that you do not abandon the path of love but remain ever open to his supernatural grace, which purifies and enlightens.
