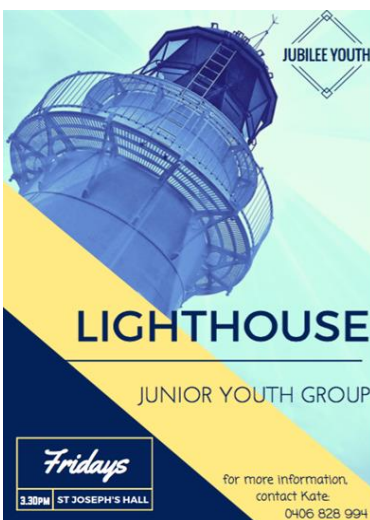

School is well and truly up and running for the second half of the year. Everyone had a terrific break and came back full of energy and ready to embrace new learning. We also welcomed new students and their families.

At our first assembly we presented the second semester Student Council with their badges and a covenant. Student Council members represent a class and are the student voice within our school community. This opportunity allows our school to share responsibility, leadership and student perspective. Members commit to weekly lunchtime meetings and communicate concerns, ideas and initiatives at school assemblies and around the school, regularly reporting back to their classes. This position is one of leadership, community spirit and building school spirit.

We have been very busy going out on excursions and sporting events. This week our Preps visited Lone Pine and the Year 1 students visited the Mt Coot-tha Botanical Gardens. Both groups had a most enjoyable day and came back brimming with stories and new knowledge. The Year 3, 4 and 5 students attended Gala days on the last two Fridays. Gala Days are an opportunity for the students to learn new skills in AFL, Soccer and netball. They also get to compete against other Catholic schools.

And it is only the beginning of week 3!



PREP LOVE - The Preps have jumped straight back into Term Three and are having fun with our weekly gymnastics and Japanese lessons.

We are enjoying discussing occupations through our English unit. At the end of last term, photographs were taken of the students with a description of what they would like to be when they are older. These are now on display outside the classroom. The Preps used this as a writing stimulus in class and practised using known letters, magic words, full stops and finger spaces when creating their text.

In Religion last week we read 'The Good Samaritan' parable. Students are beginning to make connections between Jesus' message and their own ideas about love, compassion, and making good choices. In class we used character masks to re-enact the story in small groups before presenting back to their classmates. We will begin applying this message to our own lives and how we too can be 'Good Samaritans'.

In Maths, we have been practising counting backwards from 20 in our morning class roll time. We are also looking at 'take-away' stories and practising subtraction. In our Maths rotational activities, we are using counters and hands-on manipulatives to strengthen this skill. Next week we will begin examining 3D objects. Preps will become familiar with curved and flat surfaces and start to identify objects in our world similar to these shapes.

On Wednesday we held another open day for our school. We showcased the amazing work and learning of our Students and Staff. These days require planning and preparation and the support of Staff, Student and Parents. Wednesday saw a number of Staff, Students and parents engaging with perspective members of our community.
